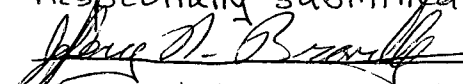
## APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

1. Petitioner, JEFFERY NEIL BRANTLEY, pro se, files this application for a sixty (60) day extension of time to file petition for writ of certiorari under Sup. Ct. R. 13(5). In support thereof Petitioner states:

2. This action began with a state trial court conviction that was timely appealed in both direct and collateral filings. After exhausting state remedies Petitioner timely petitioned the federal district court under 28 U.S.C. § 2254. After a certificate of appealability was granted Petitioner timely appealed this action in the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals. (see attached Opinion and Judgment) Petitioner timely filed petition for panel rehearing that was denied on December 10, 2021. (see attached order) This Court now has jurisdiction to hear this case on certiorari until March 20, 2022.

3. Due to the emergency status of Coronavirus and increase in positive Covid-19 tests affecting Petitioner's conditions of incarceration Petitioner requires a sixty (60) day of extension of time to file petition for writ of certiorari. Petitioner was recently released from quarantine and the housing areas at the prison are being placed on and off quarantine as the virus is spread. After quarantine Petitioner has been held in isolated confinement for ninety (90) days separated from his records and files waiting transfer to a different facility. With no access to copy/legal services provided by the prison law library and no access to the records in this case Petitioner is unable to affectively litigate the federal question before the Court without the extension of time.

4. This application is not made for purpose of delay and is made in good faith. Accordingly, Petitioner having shown good cause respectfully requests This Honorable Court or Justice GRANT the application for extension of sixty (60) days to file Petition For Writ Of Certiorari
