

Clerk of the Court,

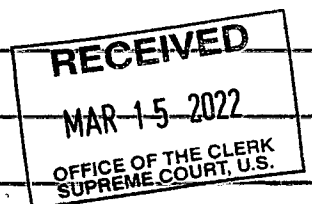


