


Peters v. Dreyer, 4:15-cv-2899 (S.D. Tex. Oct. 14, 2015); *Peters v. Dreyer*, 4:15-cv-2900 (S.D. Tex. Oct. 6, 2015); *Peters v. Gilbert*, 4:15-cv-2762 (S.D. Tex. Oct. 1, 2015). Peters's allegations do not plead any facts showing that he is in any immediate danger which would warrant waiver of the fee requirement. See *Choyce v. Dominguez*, 160 F.3d 1068, 1071 (5th Cir. 1998); *Banos v. O'Guin*, 144 F.3d 883, 884 (5th Cir. 1998).

In light of the pleadings and his litigation history, Peters fails to show that he is eligible to proceed without prepayment of fees. His motion, (Docket Entry No. 8), is denied.
