This appeal is DISMISSED, *sua sponte*, for lack of jurisdiction. Marcus O'Neal Jenkins, a Florida prisoner proceeding *pro se*, appeals the district court's July 7, 2020, order denying his second amended 28 U.S.C. § 2254 petition for writ of habeas corpus and dismissing the case with prejudice, denying as moot his motion for a ruling on the petition, and denying him a certificate of appealability. We lack jurisdiction because Mr. Jenkins filed his notice of appeal on August 10, 2020, which was over 30 days after the district court entered its order. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 2107(b); Fed. R. App. P. 4(a)(1)(A), (a)(7)(A)(ii), (c); *Hamer v. Neighborhood Hous. Servs. of Chi.*, 138 S.
