CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTORY PROVISIONS INVOLVED

- 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(1) -

"(g) it shall be unlawful for any person -

(1) who has been convicted in any court of, a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year..."

- 18 U.S.C. § 924(a)(2) -

"whoever knowingly violates subsection (a)(6), (c1), (g), (h), (i), (j), or (o) of section 922 shall be fined as provided in this title, imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both."

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

- 1) On 08-27-2014, an indictment was filed charging Mr. Patterson in one (1) count pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §922(g)(1) by the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio (505 United States v. Patterson, No. 5:14 CR 289);
- 2) On 11-21-2014, Mr. Patterson pled guilty and was subsequently sentenced to 72 months on 09-23-2015;
- 3) Mr. Patterson, via counsel, appealed such decision and, on 6-21-2017, was resentenced to 180 months;
- 4) Mr. Patterson filed an appeal which was also denied within the Sixth Circuit;
- 5) On 05-13-2021, Mr. Patterson filed a petition pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §2241 requesting relief pursuant to a single ground, Supreme Court decision within Reh'g and Appeal Court decision within Molley (quoting Reh'g).
- 6) On 11-09-2021, the Northern District of West Virginia filed its denial as to Mr. Patterson's §2241 petition. Mr. Patterson promptly filed an appeal to the Fourth Circuit.
- 7) On 03-29-2022, the Fourth Circuit ~~decided to~~ ^{affirmed} the District Court's decision. A hearing was filed and denied. On 04-26-2022, Mandate issued on 05-04-2022.

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

Mr. Patterson has demonstrated, through numerous United States Supreme Court decisions as well as countless District and Appeal Court decisions, that an indictment that fails to present every element within it violates a defendant's constitutional rights.


Mr. Patterson has further demonstrated that pursuant to the Supreme Court's decision within Rohaifi, said indictment is defective and can not stand. The District Court's allowances for such a defect to linger, even after its ruling upon the same matter (United States v. Medley, No. 18-4789 (4th Cir. 2020)), completely contradicts its standing (5).
