APPLICATION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME

Pursuant to Rule 13.5 of the Rules of this Court, Applicant Trevor Dawson Ewers hereby requests a 60-day extension of time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari up to and including Monday, January 31, 2022.

JUDGMENT FOR WHICH REVIEW IS SOUGHT

The judgment for which review is sought is *Trevor Dawson Ewers v. Commonwealth of Virginia*, Record No. 201526 (August 31, 2021) (attached as Exhibit 1).

JURISDICTION

This Court will have jurisdiction over any timely filed petition for certiorari in this case pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1254(1). Under Rules 13.1, 13.3, and 30.1 of the Rules of this Court, a petition for a writ of certiorari was due to be filed on or before November 30, 2021. In accordance with Rule 13.5, this application is being filed more than 10 days in advance of the filing date for the petition for a writ of certiorari.

REASONS JUSTIFYING AN EXTENSION OF TIME

Applicant respectfully requests a 60-day extension of time within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari seeking review of the decision of the Supreme Court of the Commonwealth of Virginia in this case, up to and including January 31, 2022.

1. Due to the novel coronavirus, also known as Covid-19, court systems throughout the country, especially in Virginia, have experienced delays, lengthened dockets, and complicated Applicant Counsel's ability to litigate cases.

2. Applicant, through his counsel, requests additional time to file his petition for a writ of certiorari seeking review because of such delays and complications caused by the pandemic.

3. Counsel would not usually ask for a 60-day extension request, but does so in order to comply with this Honorable Court's Rules as well as complications caused by local rule changes caused by the pandemic.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Applicant respectfully requests that this Court grant an extension of 60 days, up to and including January 31, 2022, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in this case.
