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**APPLICATION TO EXTEND TIME TO  
FILE A PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI**

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**Directed to the Honorable Clarence Thomas,  
Justice of the United States and Circuit Justice for the  
United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit**

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To the Honorable Clarence Thomas, as Circuit Justice for the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit:

Nicole Colton respectfully requests a 30-day extension of time to file her petition for writ of certiorari. This request, if granted, would extend the deadline from December 15, 2021 to January 14, 2022. Colton will be asking this Court to review a judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit issued on July 21, 2021 and the denial of panel and petition for rehearing en banc entered on September 16, 2021. (App. B). Colton requests this extension of time for the following reasons: Colton's counsel has multiple other deadlines, professional commitments as well as an upcoming dental surgery at UAB Hospital and an elderly out of state parent who received a medical diagnosis today that requires attention all of which hinder preparation of a petition of certiorari.

This week counsel is scheduled for overnight travel to Mobile, Alabama for in person settlement conference in the matter of *Mary Harris v. Monroe County Library Board of Trustees* 1:19, cv-00265-CG-pending in the Southern District of Alabama. On December 15, 2021 counsel has a pre-operative medical appointment with the surgeon and a separate appointment with Anesthesia Services in conjunction with surgery scheduled for December 16, 2021.

On December 10, 2021, has a brief currently due *Patton v.*

*PJ Cheese* in matter pending before the American Arbitration Association.

This case presents substantial and important questions of law, as to what an employee must show to be “regarded as disabled” and whether extreme shortness which cannot be tied to a specific physiological condition is covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act and what must be shown to survive a motion to dismiss.

For these reasons Colton respectfully requests an extension of time to file her certiorari petition, up to and including January 15, 2022.
