
Motion For 60-Day Extension To

File Certiorari

On Aug. 3, 2021 a circuit judge of the 5th Cir. denied my request for CDA. Shortly thereafter on Sept. 20, 2021 a panel of judges in the same court denied my request for rehearing. Which means the current deadline for filing my certiorari is Dec. 19, 2021.

I am requesting a 60-day extension for the following reasons:

- 1) To share my argument with someone qualified to file an amicus brief & give her enough time to ensure that her brief effectively compliments my argument instead of merely repeating it;
- 2) To draw the Court's attention to my claims by getting enough people to rally behind my cause;
- 3) To give my family time to make copies of the relevant courts' orders & opinions so I can attach the copies to my writ; &
- 4) Since I have dedicated the bulk of my time to "networking" with different institutions I need time to make sure I am familiar with the rules of the Supreme Court so I can make sure to litigate accordingly.



A 60-day extension would set the due date for filing my certiorari at Feb. 17, 2022.
