MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE PETITION FOR CERTIORARI

NOW COMES, Petitioner, JEAN COULTER ("Coulter") and files Motion for Extension of Time to File Petition for Certiorari – asking Justice Samuel Alito, circuit justice for the Third Circuit, to grant extension of time to file Petition for Certiorari with this court. In support of this Request, Coulter states :

1.) On June 2, 2021, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court denied Coulter's Petition for Allowance of Appeal (state court docket number 362 WAL 2020).

On June 11, 2021, Coulter filed Application for Reconsideration in the state's highest court.

2.) At some point in early July 2021, Coulter checked the status of this court's rule changes – and noticed that the date for timely filing had not been changed since the original "blanket" extension was issued on March 19, 2020 (in response to the pandemic), which extended the date for filing Petition for Certiorari from 90 days to 150 days.

3.) Coulter more recently noted that on July 19, 2021, that the March 2020 Order (which granted an automatic extension of 60 days for filing Petition for Certiorari) had been rescinded - and a the new Order requires that a Petition of

Certiorari will again only be considered to have been timely filed, if it is filed within 90 days of any "relevant lower court judgment".

Coulter also noted that in order to timely file Petition for Certiorari related to a judgment issued on or before July 19, 2021, remains at 150 days.

4.) In the Instant Matter, the state's highest court denied Coulter's Application for Reconsideration on July 26, 2021 – just one week after the date on which the "extended" time to file was rescinded by this court. (Exhibit A) Thus Coulter is required to file within 90 days after the denial of reconsideration of her appeal in the state's highest court.

5.) Coulter acknowledges that she negligently failed to repeatedly check for changes in this court's extension of time for filing Petition for Certiorari. However, Coulter believes that this is because, where Coulter has been recently staying (at her "family home" in Western Pennsylvania (Butler County)), Coulter has not seen any significant reduction in the negative effects of the Coronavirus – despite this reduction in cases/ hospitalizations/deaths occurring in most areas of the country. (Coulter has extended her stay in Western Pennsylvania, in order to permit her to attend the service for a COVID victim on October 16, 2021.)

Indeed, recently, the entire public transit system in that county of Western Pennsylvania was shut down, when essentially every employee in the entire transit system was required to self-quarantine after receiving a Positive COVID test and experiencing symptoms. (The "commuter" routes were able to continue at 50% service, only after the Transit Authority was able to hire a private contractor to

provide both drivers and buses for those trips (as even the transit authority's mechanics had been sickened so even maintenance for the city's fleet was impossible).)

Additionally, because the extremely low rate of vaccination as well as refusals by the majority of the county's residents to comply with mask mandates, Coulter has found it extremely difficult to even utilize the local library. Initially, the library was so severely restricting access, that it only provided 4 chairs for patrons to use indoors – in order to assure Social Distancing". Further, the library cut-off internet access outdoors – apparently as the result of too many people using the library's internet access to download movies, etc. While the library has permitted more indoor seating, it was not until September 7, 2021, that the library finally resumed its "standard" operating hours once again.

6.) Generally, applications for extension of time to file Petition for Certiorari are not favored. However, an especially significant disparity has resulted from the clearly unique situation which this court has had to address because of the effects of COVID.

For Coulter, this disparity has meant that simply because the state's highest court denied her request for Reconsideration (on July 26, 2021), just 7 days after the extension of 60 days was rescinded – that Coulter now struggles to complete her Petition for Certiorari.

WHEREFORE, Coulter requires an extension of time to file Petition for Certiorari from state court docket number 362 WAL 2020, to permit up to 150 days from the date of the dismissal by the state court (on July 26, 2021).



DECLARATION OF TIMELY FILING



TO FILE PETITION FOR CERTIORARI

NOW COMES, Petitioner, JEAN COULTER ("Coulter") and files Motion for Extension of Time to File Petition for Certiorari – asking Justice Samuel Alito, circuit justice for the Third Circuit, to grant extension of time to file Petition for Certiorari with this court. In support of this Request, Coulter states :

1.) On July 8, 2021, the Third Circuit denied Coulter's Appeal (Third Circuit docket number 21- 1164).

On July 22, 2021, Coulter filed Application for Reconsideration in the Third Circuit.

2.) At some point in early July 2021, Coulter checked the status of this court's rule changes – and noticed that the date for timely filing had not been changed since the original "blanket" extension was issued on March 19, 2020 (in response to the pandemic), which extended the date for filing Petition for Certiorari from 90 days to 150 days.

3.) Coulter more recently noted that on July 19, 2021, that the March 2020 Order (which granted an automatic extension of 60 days for filing Petition for Certiorari) had been rescinded - and a the new Order requires that a Petition of

Certiorari will again only be considered to have been timely filed, if it is filed within 90 days of any "relevant lower court judgment".

Coulter also noted that in order to timely file Petition for Certiorari related to a judgment issued on or before July 19, 2021, remains at 150 days.

4.) In the Instant Matter, the Third Circuit denied Coulter's Application for Reconsideration on August 9, 2021 (Exhibit A) Thus Coulter is required to file within 90 days after the denial of reconsideration of her appeal in the federal appellate court.

5.) Coulter acknowledges that she negligently failed to repeatedly check for changes in this court's extension of time for filing Petition for Certiorari. However, Coulter believes that this is because, where Coulter has been recently staying (at her "Mother's home" in Western Pennsylvania (Butler County)), Coulter has not seen any significant reduction in the negative effects of the Coronavirus – despite this reduction in cases/ hospitalizations/deaths occurring in most areas of the country. (Coulter has extended her stay in Western Pennsylvania, in order to permit her to attend the service for a COVID victim on October 16, 2021.)

Indeed, recently, the entire public transit system in Butler County (Western Pennsylvania) was shut down, when essentially every employee in the entire transit system was required to self-quarantine after receiving a Positive COVID test and experiencing symptoms. 6.) Recently, when reviewing this court's Order rescinding the (now expired) "automatic" 60 day extension of time for filing of Petition for Certiorari, Coulter realized that she is not certain whether her case would be eligible for the extension of time for filing based on Coulter's calculation of time based on the date of the initial decision of the appeal, by the Third Circuit (rather than the utilizing the date of denial of reconsideration).

Coulter did file for En Banc Rehearing, but, Coulter believed that she could use the date of the Panel Decision (which was on July 8, 2021 (and therefore prior to July 19, 2021)) as the starting point for the "clock" – and thus, Coulter believed that she would be permitted to file Petition for Certiorari within 150 days of July 8,

2021, rather within than 90 days of August 9, 2021. (Exhibit A) However, Coulter is uncertain of the meaning of this court's July 19, 2021 Order which states :

"... in any case in which the relevant lower court judgment, order denying discretionary review, or order denying a timely petition for rehearing was issued prior to July 19, 2021, the deadline to file a petition for a writ of certiorari remains extended to 150 days from the date of that judgment or order."

7.) Generally, applications for extension of time to file Petition for Certiorari are not favored. However, an especially significant disparity has resulted from the clearly unique situation which this court has had to address because of the effects of COVID, particularly for appeals which were decided during the summer.

For Coulter, this disparity has meant that simply because the Third Circuit affirmed the district court's decision on August 9, 2021 and the July 19, 2021 Order reverses the temporary extension of time for filing petition for Certiorari, the subsequent En Banc denial of the request for Reconsideration means that Coulter now struggles to complete her Petition for Certiorari.

WHEREFORE, Coulter requires an extension of time to file Petition for Certiorari from Third Circuit, to permit up to 150 days from the date of the dismissal by the Third Circuit on August 9, 2021 – or in the alternate, within 150 days of July 8, 2021.



MOTION TO DIRECT THE CLERK TO FILE THE *REPLACEMENT MOTION*
FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PETITION FOR CERTIORARI

NOW COMES, Petitioner, JEAN COULTER ("Coulter") and files Motion to
Direct the Clerk to File the Motion to Direct the Clerk to File the *Replacement*
Motion for Extension of Time to File Petition for Certiorari, as this Honorable Court
retains Jurisdiction in this matter, because on the date of Coulter's delivery of the
documents to UPS, 150 or fewer days had passed since the Denial of Allowance of
Appeal by the State's Highest Court – and thus This Court's Jurisdiction existed at
the time of "filing".

In Support of this Request, Coulter states :

- 1.) The Pennsylvania Supreme Court denied Allowance of Appeal in this matter, on June 2, 2021, and denied Reconsideration on July 26, 2021.
- 2.) This Court's Order of July 19, 2021 which rescinds the extension of the deadline to file petitions for writs of certiorari in all cases to 150 days from the date of the lower court judgment, order denying discretionary review, or order denying a timely petition for rehearing, is worded in such a manner that Coulter believed that she could file Petition for Certiorari under the terms of the March 19, 2020 extension of the deadline to 150 days as well as the July 19, 2021 rescission of that March 2020 Order :



"... IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in any case in which the relevant lower court judgment, order denying discretionary review, or order denying a timely petition for rehearing was issued prior to July 19, 2021, the deadline to file a petition for a writ of certiorari remains extended to 150 days from the date of that judgment or order. In any case in which the relevant lower court judgment, order denying discretionary review, or order denying a timely petition for rehearing was issued on or after July 19, 2021, the deadline to file a petition for a writ of certiorari is as provided by Rule 13. ..."

3.) Nevertheless, Coulter still chose to file a timely Motion for Extension of Time to File the Petition for Writ of Certiorari (Exhibit A). Indeed, a Motion for Extension of Time to File in the Instant Matter was mailed in the same envelope as Coulter's Motion for Extension of Time in Coulter v. Dunbar (a case from the District Court) (*Exhibit B*) – and This Court granted extension of Time to File in Coulter v. Dunbar on November 4, 2021 at 21A127.

However, for whatever reason, Coulter's Motion for Extension in relation to the Instant Matter, was never filed in This Court. Thus Coulter was never granted Extension of Time to File to permit Coulter to file Petition for Writ of Certiorari in this matter within 150 days of the date of denial of Reconsideration on July 26, 2021 – so, Coulter filed her Petition for Writ of Certiorari within 150 days from *June 2, 2021* (the date of the initial denial of Allowance of Appeal in the state's highest court).

4.) Coulter was/is anxious for This Honorable Court to "review" the Instant Matter, as this case was dismissed by a State (Trial) Court exclusively based on Unconstitutional limitations produced by a retired state court judge, in an unrelated matter. And, due to a similarly Unconstitutional Order from the state's

Intermediate Appellate Court, the Trial Court's dismissal has never been reviewed by any jurist.

5.) Coulter believes that the wording of the July 19, 2021 order permits Coulter's Petition for Writ of Certiorari to be considered timely filed, as it was filed within 150 days of June 2, 2021 (the date of Denial of Allowance of Appeal, as Coulter believes is permitted by both the March 202 Order and the July 19, 2021 rescission of the March 2020 Order).

6.) *The Clerk has not been able to locate Coulter's (first) Motion for Extension of Time to File the Petition for Writ of Certiorari in the matter of Coulter v. Paulisick, despite the fact that it was sent to This Court in the same envelope as the Motion for Extension of Time to File the Petition for Certiorari in Coulter v. Dunbar.*

7.) *Coulter has attached copies of evidence of Coulter's timely filing of Motion for Extension of Time to File the Petition for Writ of Certiorari in the matter of Coulter v. Paulisick - which includes :*

a. *The pertinent portion of "sent" mail from Coulter's email account (Exhibit C)*

b.) *Copies of the email sent by Coulter on October 8, 2021 at 2:23 pm to the "printer" at print.marketing0680@staples.com for Coulter v. Paulisick (Exhibit D) and the email sent to the same address at 2:05 pm for the matter of Coulter v. Dunbar (Exhibit E)*

c.) *A copy of the email sent later on October 8, 2021 (7:16 pm) to Paulisicks' counsel, to provide service to Counsel of Coulter's filing of motion for*
