The USCA6 has filed an Order on September 28, 2021. Pursuant to the Sixth Circuit Rule 13.5, Petitioner's complete Petition for a Writ of Certiorari was due December 27, 2021. Petitioner *pro se* previously filed an Application for an Extension of Time postmarked December 14, 2021 and received December 27, 2021.
