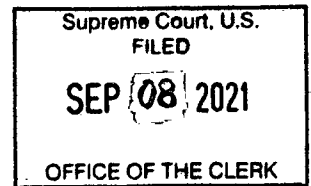

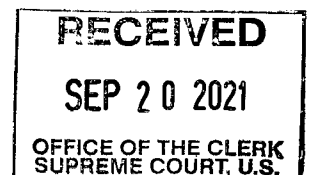


TO THE CLERK OF THE HONORABLE JUSTICE

In addition because I am petitioning pro-se, the law library at my institution of confinement has not, but for the most part staffing and security concerns, allowed me always to be afforded my full time to access the Court by use of the law library for inmates, and there are no inmates to assist me, as this Court articulated in *Boonas v. Smith* 430 U.S. 817, 828 (77). In short, I do not have enough time per week to have access to the prison law library and need the extension to carefully craft my case for review to prevent a manifest miscarriage of justice and further harm to the public.
