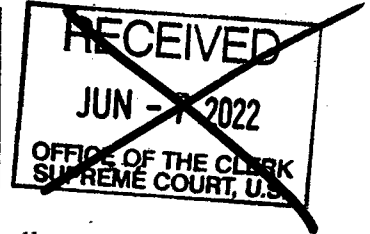
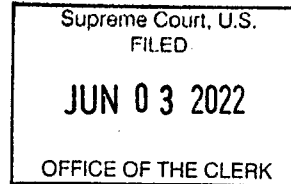

To: Justice Clarence Thomas

Dear Justice Thomas,



I am Minnie McCall, and I am asking for a 60-day extension of time to file all necessary paperwork pertaining to filing a Writ of Certiorari pertaining to my housing discrimination case coming from the Middle District of Alabama and then on to the Eleventh Circuit of the Appellate Court. The court case is No. 19-14870. Justice Thomas as I talked to a clerk on yesterday and it was explained to me that there was no certain format to use in asking for an extension. Yet I was informed that I should be sure to ask for the time needed for the extension.

As the constitution clearly reference that every citizen in this country regardless of race, lineage or national origin have full rights yet not everyone shares that opinion as it is clearly documented in various civil rights cases. The Fair Housing Act, Brown v Board of Education and many other civil rights cases especially doing the civil rights movement set out to correct past errors in the various Federal housing and civil rights laws. Yet we are dealing with people who just do not try to maintain equal housing rights in this country. As I was trying to prepare for this filing of the Writ of Certiorari several things happened that was a major hindrance for me to proceed in a timely manner in this especially important matter. I was having a health crisis which began about two years ago yet gotten chronic in mid-April of this year. After getting ill in mid-April, I began to get sicker while having to receive Doctor's care three times in a matter of 5 days. I had respiratory distress, so severe and I was checked/tested for covid at two separate visits. I was already seeking tests as to whether I was suffering from "long Covid"/


sometimes referred to as "long hauler covid" after being chronically ill in December 2020.

Justice Thomas I was extremely ill, and I simply did not have the energy to do research as to file the Writ of Certiorari yet by Thursday of last week I began to get better and began calling the Clerk's office, yet we never connected until yesterday.

This case is a very important case because not only will race factor in this matter before the court, yet lineage is also a very important factor as well because I am a descendant of American slaves seeking a justice claim from the court. All of the purported people which discriminated against my family and I and claimed to be African American in this case do not all share the same lineage as myself and my then minor children while one of the then minor children was then and is a member of the Cheyenne Arapaho tribe. I think this is very interesting because the Defendants in this case attempts to allude that since many off the people purported to be discriminating against myself and my family were African American's that I have no justice claim. Justice Thomas my amended brief in the Appeals court will show a detailed look at the discrimination I suffered at the hands of the Defendant's, the Montgomery Housing Authority. A really important factor is that discovery was corrupted by the Defendants, and it is indicated by the Defendants this was done with the assistance of my then own attorney. The Defendants alleges this attorney asks for no discovery. My then attorney had implied to me that she had indeed, requested my entire file folder as discovery and was given access to my complete folder. I am a tenant of the Montgomery Housing Choice Voucher Program. Yet neither I nor my then attorney was ever given full access to my tenant's file folder which would hold all the needed discovery for this housing case. I requested my then attorney to withdraw from the case in about December 2018, I am asking to be allowed to have additional time to prepare for completing the proper forms for the Writ of Certiorari.
