
Dear Mr. Harris:

I represent the National Association of Manufacturers, the Chamber of Commerce of the United States of America, and the Information Technology Industry Council (collectively, the "private respondents"), which were intervenor-defendants in the district court, appellees in the court of appeals, and therefore respondents in the above-captioned case at this Court.

The petition for writ of certiorari in this case was filed on May 1, 2023, and docketed on May 4, 2023. The private respondents' brief in opposition is therefore currently due on June 5, 2023. On May 26, 2023, the government—also a respondent in this case—requested an extension of the time within which to file its response, to and including July 5, 2023.

Pursuant to Rules 15.3 and 30.4 of the rules of this Court, the private respondents respectfully request a corresponding extension of the time to file their own brief in opposition, to and including July 5, 2023. The extension is requested to enable the private respondents to prepare a brief in opposition that will best assist the Court in its consideration of the petition, due in part to forthcoming *amicus* briefs that multiple entities have noted an intention to file.
