As required by Supreme Court Rule 33.1(h), I certify that this petition for a Writ of Mandamus contains 8,188 words, excluding the parts of the petition that are exempted by Supreme Court Rule 33.1(d); the word count, including footnotes, is based on, and relied upon, the Microsoft Word processor system employed.

The parameters selected, and relied upon, using Microsoft Word, include Century Schoolbook typeset (selecting 12-point type with 2-point leading between lines in the main text and the appendix text body, and, 10-point type with 2-point leading between lines in the footnote body). Quotations that exceeded 50 words were indented. The text of the petition, and of the appendix, was printed on both sides of the papers (pages). The petition, and the appendix, was contracted to a print service provider with the following standards described: presented on white 60 pound (weight) paper with a cover of the petition (front, and back) presented on white 65 pound (weight) paper, with the same dimension of 6.125 (inches) by 9.250 (inches); the text on each page, including footnotes, is centered and does not exceed the requirements of 4.125 (inches) by 7.125 (inches); the margins of 0.750 (inches), on all sides, is not compromised and does not hinder the viewing of the text; and, perfect binding completed the packaging. Forty (40) copies of the petition were prepared, packaged, and sent through the United Parcel Service to the Office of the Clerk, Supreme Court of the United States; 1 First Street, N. E., Washington, DC 20543. In addition, this Certificate of Compliance, a Certificate of Service, and an unbound hard copy of the petition for the Writ of Mandamus (that includes the Appendix) is provided. A check of \$300.00 is also included within this package.
