Re: Tyler v. Hennepin Cty. (No. 22-166), Request to Include Property Records

Dear Mr. Harris:

The State of Minnesota is preparing an amicus brief in this case. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 32.3, I seek the Court's permission to include the property record for the condominium at the center of this appeal with our brief and permission to file it in something other than the booklet format.

Petitioner Geraldine Tyler raises constitutional concerns with the forfeiture and sale of her property as a result of her non-payment of property taxes. Yet a key document, the county's official summary of transactions regarding the property that Ms. Tyler owned, is not in the record below. Respondents' brief references information contained in the property record (Resp'ts Br. 14) and the State of Minnesota plans to reference the property records in its amicus brief.

Further, although it is a public document subject to judicial notice under Fed. R. Evid. 201, obtaining it requires multiple steps. Access requires both a subscription agreement (and new subscriptions may take two days to process) and the payment of fees. *See* https://www.hennepin.us/residents/property/real-estate-document-copies-and-research. As a result, for the convenience of the Court, parties, and the public, the State seeks permission to include the property record with its amicus brief to the Court. The document is nine pages in a landscape format, with small type, and therefore would not be amenable to print in booklet format. As our brief is due on April 5, I appreciate your expedited consideration of this request.
