Mr. Harris:

I am counsel for the respondents in this case. After receiving an extension of time to file her petition, petitioner filed her petition for a writ of certiorari on August 29, 2022. Respondents filed a waiver of response on September 28, 2022. I subsequently received your letter dated October 11, 2022 requesting a response to the petition. According to the online docket, a response is currently due on November 10, 2022. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, respondents respectfully request that the time for filing a response be extended by 32 days, up to and including December 12, 2022.

This is respondents' first request for an extension of time. Two amicus curiae briefs were filed in this matter. An extension of time will permit respondents to sufficiently address the arguments raised by petitioner and amici, and other issues relevant to the Court's decision to grant or deny the petition. No party will be prejudiced by the extension requested herein.

Accordingly, respondents respectfully request that the time for filing a response is extended by 32 days, up to and including December 12, 2022. Counsel for the petitioner, Madeline Meth, has informed respondents via telephone and email that petitioner does not object to this request.
