Consent Motion for Extension of Time to File Merits Briefs

Dear Mr. Harris:

By this letter, petitioner moves this Court to grant the parties mutual two-week extensions to file their merits briefs in the above-listed case. Respondent's counsel has informed undersigned counsel that respondent consents to the briefing schedule requested in this motion.

The Court granted certiorari on June 30, 2023. Without an extension, petitioner's brief (and the joint appendix) would be due on August 14, 2023, and respondent's brief would be due on September 13, 2023. With the requested mutual two-week extensions, petitioner's brief (and the joint appendix) would be due on **August 28, 2023**, and respondent's brief would be due on **October 11, 2023**. The due date for petitioner's reply brief would be governed by this Court's Rule 25.3. The parties understand that this case will be scheduled for argument during the Court's December 2023 sitting.

Petitioner seeks this extension because of the press of business in his counsel's office, including preparation of a merits brief in the Texas Supreme Court and a range of matters in the federal courts of appeals. In addition, the staff in

petitioner's counsel's office has recently turned over, and new counsel will require time to familiarize themselves with the issues in this case.

For these reasons, petitioner respectfully moves this Court to grant the mutual two-week extensions set forth above.
