Dear Mr. Bickell:

I have recently been retained as counsel for respondents in the above-referenced case. On September 8, 2022, the Court docketed the petition for a writ of certiorari in the case. Unless extended by the Court, the response would be due on October 11, 2022. For the reasons that follow, and pursuant to Rule 30.4, I respectfully request an extension of 30 days, to and including November 10, 2022, for the filing of a brief in opposition.

An extension is necessary because I require time to familiarize myself with the case in light of my recent retention. In addition, I have several pressing obligations in the coming weeks, including the preparation of a merits amicus brief in this Court as well as deadlines in a number of matters in lower courts.
