Dear Mr. Harris:

I am counsel of record for Respondents in the above-captioned case. For the reasons below, we write to request an extension of time to file Respondents' brief in opposition to the petition for a writ of certiorari from November 14, 2022, to December 13, 2022. Petitioners, through counsel, consent to an extension to December 6, 2022. This Court previously granted Respondents' motion to extend the time to file a response from October 14, 2022, to November 14, 2022.

Counsel for Respondents face significant competing professional obligations, including a class certification hearing in *Anderson v. Labcorp*, No. 1:17 CIV 193 (M.D.N.C.) on November 8; election-related support and response in anticipation of final vote certification on November 18, in North Carolina counties; filing plaintiff-appellee's merits brief in *Billard v. Charlotte Catholic High School*, No. 22-1440 (4th Cir.), due November 23; and discovery deadlines in *Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc. v. Raffensperger*, No. 1:21-cv-5337-SJC (N.D. Ga.). These and other professional and personal commitments during the response period would make it difficult for counsel to prepare the response in this case.
