On July 8, 2022, Petitioner Leroy McGill filed a Petition for Writ of Certiorari in this capital case. The State of Arizona's Response is currently due September 12, 2022. Under this Court's Rules 15.3 and 30.4, the State respectfully requests a second extension of 30 days, to and including Wednesday, October 12, 2022, to file a Brief in Opposition.
