Jury Charge

1 prescribing of controlled substances is upon the prescribing
2 practitioner.

3 Fourth, no statutory definition of legitimate medical
4 purpose and usual course of professional practice exists. It
5 is up to you, as jurors, to decide whether a defendant
6 prescribed controlled substances without a legitimate medical
7 purpose and outside the usual course of professional practice.

8 Fifth, "prescription" means an order for medication
9 which is dispensed to or for an ultimate user.

10 Sixth, "individual practitioner" includes a
11 physician, dentist, veterinarian, nurse practitioner, physician
12 assistant, or other individual licensed, registered, or
13 otherwise permitted by the United States, or the jurisdiction
14 in which she practices, to dispense a controlled substance in
15 the usual course of professional practice, but does not include
16 a pharmacist, a pharmacy, or an institutional practitioner.

17 Finally, whether a practitioner -- finally, whether a
18 prescription is made in the usual course of professional
19 practice is to be determined from an objective and not a
20 subjective viewpoint.

21 You have also heard the 2001 Tennessee Intractable
22 Pain Treatment Act discussed during this trial. You are
23 instructed that the Intractable Pain Treatment Act in relevant
24 part states:

25 Section 5(f): Nothing in this section, the Pain
