

PREAMBLE

Pursuant to Rule 44.1 of this Court, Petitioner Francette Washington, respectfully petitions for a rehearing of the denial of a writ of certiorari to review the judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit.

The purpose behind the Family Medical Leave Act was to promote equality, preserve and solidify people's civil rights, and nurture a strong American workforce and economy. What VIA Metropolitan Transit, the City of San Antonio, the District Court, and the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals have done is to weaken the People and their faith in the system and the concept of equality, which has led to an impotent workforce. People don't want to work anymore, and they have learned that they don't have to work, in order to survive. People have learned that they do not have to tolerate toxic work environments; and, the corporations and industries who insist upon the bottom line instead of valuing the human beings who get them there will die, and our economy on a global scale may lose its power. The People are no longer unified in a common goal. The Court must grant review in this case, so as to address the problem of one of our country's largest cities.

PETITION FOR REHEARING

The original certiorari petition asked this Court to 1) address the toxic work environment of a large, government-subsidized corporation in San Antonio, Texas, one of the country's largest cities and cultural hubs and 2) that this Court re-affirm and solidify the People's FMLA rights up against a company that provides a city of over two million people and a popular tourist destination their public transportation.

The Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals did not provide the reasons for their opinion that this large, government-subsidized company and its employees were entitled to Summary Judgment.


REASONS FOR REHEARING


