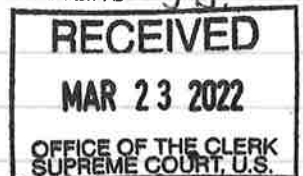

the Appellant has not had access to the proper research materials, nor can determine when they will be available by virtue of the transfer, the Appellant needs more time to prepare the Petition.

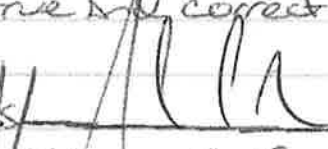
Conclusion
