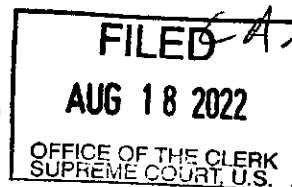

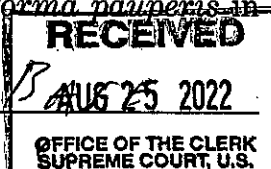

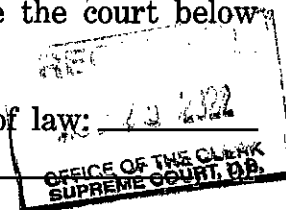

**Dinesh D'Souza** and **True the Vote** released the documentary **2,000 Mules** on May 3. The film, which played in select theaters and online, cited geotracking and video evidence to prove Democrats used illegal ballot trafficking to steal the 2020 election in six battleground states. In Atlanta, Georgia, at least 242 "ballot mules" stuffed illegal mail-in ballots into 10 or more drop boxes each. Surveillance video shows these criminals inserting one ballot after another voting in the dead of night, using gloves so as not to leave fingerprints, and/or taking photos of themselves with a stack of ballots at the drop box to prove to whomever sent them that they had done the deed—so they could get paid. Biden officially won Georgia by only 11,779 votes, which means that these 242 individuals committed enough fraud to steal the state from actual voters. **2,000 Mules** presents similar evidence of theft in the greater areas of Detroit, Michigan; Milwaukee, Wisconsin; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and Phoenix, Arizona.

Yet you probably have not heard much about this documentary. Why not? Because minutes after it debuted, *Politico* published a leaked draft majority opinion written by Justice **Samuel Alito**. The leak reveals that the Supreme Court intends to overturn the landmark 1973 **Roe v. Wade** ruling that transformed abortion into a special federally guaranteed right. A draft majority opinion had never leaked to the public before, and this ruling would overturn one of the most controversial and unconstitutional rulings in Supreme Court history. But notice the timing. Justice Alito authored this draft two months prior to the leak. The Supreme Court was not scheduled to publish its majority opinion until two months later. So whoever leaked the draft chose to leak it precisely at the release of **2,000 Mules**. They wanted to distract people from the election steal—and they succeeded. Pro-abortion protesters showed up at the homes of justices **John Roberts** and **Brett Kavanaugh** in May. Justice Alito and his family were moved to an undisclosed location for their safety. Abortionists have tried to frighten at least one justice into changing his or her vote before the decision is released later this year.

While Americans are fighting over the Constitution and over the murder of babies, other nations are looking to exploit America's internal divisions. U.S. Air Force Chief Software Officer **Nicolas Chailan** (Ret.) told Fox News on May 3 that there is evidence that China may already
