12 (1) Why did the Respondent conduct their own investigation regarding the Petitioner?
13 (2) How did the Respondent conclude that the Petitioner committed a crime on July 10,2018
14 while the Petitioner was an ER patient at Alaska Regional Hospital?
15 (3) Why is the Respondent, Alaska Regional Hospital, Chester Gilmore (attorney for Alaska
16 Regional Hospital) accusing and making false allegations and statements against the
17 Petitioner?
18 (4) Why is the Petitioner not allowed to maintain her privacy from the Respondent
19 regarding her medical visits and ER Visits at Alaska Regional Hospital?
20 (5) Does the Petitioner have a legal right to consult a social worker request from the
21 attending ER physician at Alaska Regional Hospital?
22 (6) Who is the Respondent contacting at Alaska Regional Hospital regarding the Petitioner
23 and her hospital visits?
24 (7) Did the Respondent violate HIPPA guidelines regarding the Petitioner after the
25 Respondent conducted their own investigation and had concluded that the Petitioner

(10) Is the Respondent protected under sovereign immunity when they conducted their own investigation after APD had arrested the Petitioner on July 18, 2018 and concluded that the Petitioner had committed the crime on July 10, 2018 when the Petitioner was an ER patient at Alaska Regional Hospital and not on July 12, 2018?

(11) Alaska Regional Hospital Employee Georgianna Yonuschot submitted an affidavit and 4-page timeline to FBI Agent Derek Despelland approximately 20 days after the charges were dismissed against the Petitioner. Georgianna Yonuschot stated that the Petitioner was seen on July 10, 2018 and was released without incident. How did the Respondent conclude that the Petitioner had committed the crime on July 10, 2018 after they conducted their own investigation and yet Alaska Regional Hospital Employee Georgianna Yonuschot stated in her 4-page timeline that the Petitioner was released without incident?

(12) Is the Respondent protected under sovereign immunity when there is corruption involved?

(13) Is the Respondent legally allowed to conduct their own investigation on a private citizen after law enforcement (APD) arrests the private citizen?

12 STATEMENT OF THE CASE

13 On July 10,2018, the Petitioner was an Emergency Room patient at Alaska Regional Hospital. The
14 petitioner had requested a consult with a social worker which is within her legal right.

15 On July 12, 2018, Alaska Regional Hospital had stated that the Petitioner had called in a bomb
16 threat.

17 On July 18, 2018, the Petitioner was arrested by APD. The Petitioner who is a victim of a pre-
18 meditated hate that involves white APD officers in which the Petitioner 's upper body with her left side being
19 the target of injury was injured. The Petitioner was denied medical treatment when she requested it from
20 APD. The Petitioner's injuries were again re injured from APD. APD failed to an investigation to the
21 allegations that were made from Alaska Regional Hospital. (S-18204, MULLIGAN VS MUNI OF
22 ANCHORAGE/APD, #3AN-19-07393CI, MULLIGAN VS MUNICIPLAITY OF ANCHORAGE/APD)

23 On September 28, 2018, the Respondent filed an amended motion with the Anchorage Superior
24 Court in case #3AN-18-06534CR in which the Respondent had conducted their own investigation regarding
25 the Petitioner in which they had concluded that the Petitioner had committed the crime of calling in a bomb
threat at Alaska Regional Hospital on July 10, 2018, in which the Petitioner was an ER Patient at Alaska
Regional Hospital.

On March 27, 2019, in case #3AN-18-06534CR, State of Alaska vs Anne Mulligan was dismissed against the Petitioner.

On or about April 19, 2019 (approximately 20 days after the charges were dismissed against the Petitioner) Alaska Regional Hospital employee Georgianna Yonuschut had submitted an affidavit and a 4-page timeline to FBI Agent Derek Despeland (approximately 20 days after the charges were dismissed against the Petitioner) stating that the Petitioner was seen on July 10, 2018 and was discharged without incident.

On December 1, 2021, in Alaska Supreme Court case #S-18089, (Anchorage Superior Court #3AN-19-07393CI) Mulligan vs. Galen Hospital Aka: Alaska Regional Hospital filed their Appellee's Brief in which Alaska Regional Hospital and their Attorney Chester Gilmore made a false statement/allegation against the Petitioner on page 4 of their brief stating that the Petitioner had made a bomb threat on July 25, 2018. Alaska Regional Hospital and Attorney Chester Gilmore has not provided proof of the Petitioner making a BOMB THREAT on July 10, 2018, and July 25, 2018.

The Petitioner did not make any bomb threats on July 10,2018 and July 25, 2018. The FBI has not contacted the Petitioner making any bomb threat(s). The Petitioner is being framed from false accusations/allegations by the corruption of the State of Alaska Attorney General's office, Chester Gilmore of Cashion, Gilmore and Lindemuth (attorney for Alaska Regional Hospital) Alaska Regional Hospital, and the Municipality of Anchorage/APD (Anchorage Police Department) Officer's.

13 **REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION**

14 Anne Mulligan, Petitioner is petitioning the Supreme Court of the United States to grant the
15 Petitioner Anne Mulligan her petition based on the following reasons:

16 Anne Mulligan was an ER patient on July 10, 2018, and the Respondent did not prove what
17 crime that the Petitioner had committed on July 10, 2018.

18 The Respondent did not explain as to why they conducted their own investigation and
19 violated HIPPA guidelines regarding the Petitioner and concluded that she committed a crime on July 10,
20 2018, and yet Alaska Regional Hospital Employee Georgianna Yonschust had stated in her 4-page timeline
21 and affidavit that she had submitted to FBI agent Derek Despeland that the Petitioner was treated and
22 released without incident on July 10, 2018.

23 The Respondent, APD, Alaska Regional Hospital and Chester Gilmore (attorney for Alaska
24 Regional Hospital are intentionally framing the Petitioner with harmful accusations and allegations of
25 making a bomb threat that she has not committed. Alaska Regional Hospital and their Attorney Chester
26 Gilmore provided proof of their false allegations on page 4 of Alaska Regional Hospital's Appellee Brief that
27 was submitted to the Alaska Supreme Court on December 1, 2021, by their Attorney Chester Gilmore.
