**MEMORANDUM ON DISMISSAL**

Plaintiff Michael G. Peters is an inmate of the Stringfellow Unit of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice—Correctional Institutions Division. He sues Mital K. Brahmbhatt, alleging that Brahmbhatt was part of a criminal conspiracy to falsify medical records in November 2012, faxed those false records to an attorney, and caused Peters to be convicted of retaliation in 2015. He seeks \$200,000 in compensatory damages. Dkt 1.

Peters proceeds here *pro se*. He also moves to proceed *in forma pauperis*. Dkt 2. A national prisoner index shows that he has filed at least ninety petitions for a writ of *habeas corpus* and civil rights suits since 2015, many of which have been dismissed as frivolous or for failure to state a claim. Chief Judge Lee Rosenthal imposed a preclusion order on March 21, 2022, in civil action number 4:22-cv-0059, barring Peters from filing any new cases in this district without written authorization from a judge of this district.

Peters hasn't obtained written authorization to file this present action. And nothing in his pleadings shows that he

faces the type of “imminent danger of serious physical injury” that supports an exception to the payment of the filing fee. 28 USC § 1915(g). He is thus barred from filing his complaint without the payment of associated fees.

The complaint by Plaintiff Michael G. Peters is DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE as barred by the three-strikes provision of 28 USC § 1915(g). Dkt 1. The complaint will be reinstated if Peters pays the \$402 filing fee within thirty days of the entry of this Order.

The motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* is DENIED. Dkt 2.

Any other motions are DENIED AS MOOT.
