Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 39, Petitioner Demmerick Eric Brown hereby moves for leave to proceed *in forma pauperis*. Petitioner seeks leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* for the purpose of filing a Petition for Writ of Certiorari and for filing all later documents if his Petition for Writ of Certiorari is allowed. In support of this motion, Petitioner states as follows:

1. The United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit appointed the undersigned counsel of record to represent Petitioner under the Criminal Justice Act of 1964, 18 U.S.C. § 3006A, on July 16, 2021. *See* Fourth Circuit Docket No. 20-6448, ECF No. 18 (order of appointment); *see also* ECF No. 16 (notice to appointed counsel dated July 15, 2021).

2. Petitioner has asked the undersigned counsel of record to file a Petition for Writ of Certiorari on his behalf. Petitioner has been continuously incarcerated, except for one period of time lasting less than two years, since the mid-1980s. Petitioner is serving a term of imprisonment and remains indigent.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner Demmerick Eric Brown respectfully requests the Court to allow his motion to proceed *in forma pauperis*.
