MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

Kevin Burns, the petitioner, seeks leave, pursuant to Sup. Ct. R. 39, to contemporaneously file a petition for a writ of certiorari without payment of costs and to proceed *in forma pauperis* without prepayment of fees.

Mr. Burns is an indigent Tennessee death row inmate. State v. Burns, 979 S.W.2d 276 (Tenn. 1998). The district court found Mr. Burns to be indigent and entitled to appointment of counsel pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3599 and 21 U.S.C. § 848, and the Federal Public Defender for the Middle District of Tennessee was appointed to represent him. Burns v. Mays, No. 06-cv-2311 (W.D. Tenn. June 1, 2006), R. 4, PageID# 131-32. However, he was not granted leave to file his habeas petition in

forma pauperis and was required to pay the \$5.00 filing fee. *Id.* at 133. He did so. The court of appeals granted Mr. Burns permission to proceed *in forma pauperis* on appeal. *Burns v. Mays*, 11-5214 (6th Cir. Feb. 8, 2013), ECF 52-1, p. 3.
