## MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

Petitioner Walter Raglin, pursuant to Sup. Ct. R. 39.1, respectfully moves for leave to file the accompanying petition for writ of certiorari in the Supreme Court of the United States without payment of costs and to proceed in forma pauperis.

Petitioner Raglin was previously found financially unable to obtain counsel. The United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio first appointed counsel for Petitioner Raglin under former 21 U.S.C. ¶ 848, now 18 U.S.C. ¶ 3599. The same court later authorized that private, appointed counsel to withdraw and, pursuant to the same statutory provision, appointed Petitioner Raglin's replacement counsel from the Office of the Federal Public Defender for the Southern District of Ohio, Capital Habeas Unit. Therefore, in reliance upon Rule 39.1 and 18 U.S.C. § 3599(e), Petitioner Raglin has not attached the affidavit which would otherwise be required by 28 U.S.C. § 1746.

No execution date is presently scheduled.
