The petitioner appeals the district court's order denying his motion to vacate filed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2255. In order to assist its proceedings, the district court appointed the petitioner counsel pursuant to the Criminal Justice Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3006A. Counsel now moves to continue his appointment for purposes of appeal.
