



## ORDER

By order dated April 18, 2018, Petitioner was prohibited from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court challenging his convictions from 1988 without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court. On June 27, 2022, Petitioner sought permission to file an application for post-conviction relief or a petition for a writ of habeas corpus in the circuit court. By order dated July 1, 2022, this Court denied Petitioner's request.

Based on an order in a different matter involving Petitioner, the Court mistakenly notified Petitioner his motion for permission to file would not be considered absent payment of a filing fee and submission of an affidavit indicating he, in good faith, believes the matter raised in his petition is nonfrivolous and proper for the Court to consider in its original jurisdiction. Petitioner has now filed an affidavit and the filing fee as requested.

We consider the affidavit a request for rehearing of the July 1, 2022 order. Petitioner has not shown any reason for the Court to reconsider the denial of his request for permission to file. Accordingly, we deny the request for rehearing. Because Petitioner was mistakenly required to pay a filing fee, we direct the Clerk of Court to return that fee to Petitioner.
