I am writing to set the record straight regarding any questions and misconceptions surrounding the motives and events concerning my deceased children Macy Mamnone and James Mamnone IV, as well as their grandmother Margaret Eakin.

The news media has accurately reported that I gave a taped confession to Canton police detectives in which I admitting to ending the mortal lives of the three aforementioned people. I would not do anything so drastic without owing up to it.

However, the police did not ask me what my motives were that prompted the killings, nor did I offer any such information to them.

In the absence of a factual motive for this tragic loss of life, the media has conjectured that I acted in vengeance against my wife, who sought to break apart our children's immediate family. It has been claimed in the media that my precious children lost their lives so their mother would be subject to extreme mental anguish.

I understand that through conjecture the media means to sell the public a villainous monster. However, the claims of my motive - regarding my children - are false and unfounded.

Beginning at 4 PM on Sunday, June 7th, I began 14 hours of continuously attempting to resolve the conflict between the children's mother and I regarding the unacceptable living situation that she and the Stark County Family Courts (specifically the "professional homewrecker" Judge Jim James) had placed our children into. My wife was unwilling to act to protect her children even though she knew I believed death was a viable solution. I did not wish for harm to come to my children, but I concluded there was no other way to ensure they were going to receive to proper spiritual care they had been promised.

After somberly taking my precious children's lives while they slept in the early morning hours of Monday, June 8th, only then did I become enraged.

Vexation overcame me, and I sought to make the family who turned their backs me, and my wife, who allowed the unthinkable to happen to our children, feel my pain.

Only one block from Westminster Community Church - the sacred grounds where I send my children back to their Creator - my mother-in-law was resting in her guest room. I drove to her home and entered it. I went upstairs and murdered her in a savage manner - then I fled her home. I went into shock. Eventually, I made arrangements to turn my children over to the police.

While my children were absolutely not killed out of revenge, my mother-in-law was. It was wrong of me to kill her and I am very sorry that I did. I was not in a proper state of mind when doing so.

To make matters worse, I called my wife and taunted her about the killings that transpired. That, of course, did hurt her.

Before starting our family, I made it abundantly clear to my wife that I would never accept our children growing up in a household where their biological parents were not both present, and lived as husband and wife. My wife agreed to my demands; she assured me we would be together forever - a claim that we swore to God we would uphold several years before when we spoke our Christian wedding vows.

I firmly believe that no good comes to children who are subjected to the divorce of their parents. Children who live in a broken home environment are often put under the supervision of persons who are not emotionally connected to the children in a manner that enables them to make the protection and well being of said children their utmost priority. The needs of the child becomes secondary to the desires and ulterior motives of the chartatans to whom their care has been entrusted.

Sadly, many children's safety and innocence are compromised. More times than not, mistreated children develop pervasive psychological difficulties which may adversely affect all aspects of their lives; physical, mental and emotional problems stay with them throughout adulthood.

This was not going to happen to my children I pledged my life to God to protect from the harm of immorality.

We live in dangerous times were God's laws are perceived as being antiquated. Satan has been leading a costly war against family values for the past 50 years.

Divorce has become commonplace. Satan has been able to establish divorce as a norm of society; when our peers get divorced, they are unknowingly working as Satan's enablers of immorality. Many people who are convinced that they are good people, are being coerced by the kingdom of darkness into perpetuating the moral decay of our culture.

With divorce working as a post-modern plague, recent generations of our people have been exposed to - and embraced - a myriad of other sins as well.

Sin has taken a stranglehold on: our governments and economies; our workplaces; our social and sexual habits; our perceptions of morality and propriety; the media; and the value we place on education.

Yes, I know, I stand on a very high soapbox for being a murderer.

I have always cared for my fellow Cantonians, and they are looking for answers as to why so much violence is cropping up in our proud community. I speak to this matter honestly, as it pertains to my specific, and how I view the world in general.

While I confess to being totally without just cause for needlessly murdering Margaret Eakin, I still feel as though I did the most merciful thing I could do for my children bases upon the conditions of their environment, and the bleak outlook of the future they were to face.

If the public is outraged over the loss of my children's life, then I beseech them to not let Macy and James die in vain!

Stop getting divorces!

Stop breaking up your children's homes!

Stop making vows to God that you aren't will to keep!

Two wonderful, well-loved children are now gone from our community.

Are there two couples out there who are willing to say "enough is enough" and pledge to each other to solemnly uphold the traditional family values that make children thrive?

I hope so. The lives of my children were much too short, but their existence can still have a profound meaning.

I believe there is a lot of good in the world, and all of that good is bestowed upon us as blessings from God.

Far too many people have chosen to forsake their heavenly Father and embrace a lifestyle filled with sin and iniquity.

The six-page letter, scrawled in pencil on sheets ripped from a yellow legal pad, begins with those words.

More shocking are the claims that follow and the name at the end, signed three times: James Mammone III.

Mammone, 35, of Canton, sits in the Stark County Jail, charged with aggravated murder and facing a death sentence if convicted of killing his two children and his former mother-in-law in June.

He has pleaded not guilty and his trial is set for January.

The Repository received two unsolicited letters Monday that appear to have been written by Mammone. They came in one envelope identifying them as inmate mail. A jail supervisor confirmed that Mammone had sent a letter to the newspaper.

The main letter dealt with Mammone's case. The second letter comments on another, unrelated homicide.

The writer, claiming to be Mammone, doesn't deny responsibility for the killings with which he is charged - "I would not do anything so drastic without owing up to it," the letter states - and tries to explain his motives in a lengthy essay that condemns his ex-wife, society, courts and the media, and calls divorce a tool of Satan.

"Yes, I know, I stand on a very high soapbox for being a murderer," the writer admits.

NOT REVENGE

Authorities say Mammone fatally stabbed 5-year-old Macy Mammone and 3-year-old James Mammone IV. Police found them strapped into child-safety seats in the car Mammone was driving.

Mammone's former mother-in-law, Margaret Eakin, 57, was shot to death in her Poplar Avenue NW home.

Police have said Mammone confessed to the June 8 killings, saying he wanted to hurt his ex-wife, Marcia Eakin, following their divorce, which was finalized in April.

The letter claims that Mammone never gave investigators a reason for the killings and that they didn't ask.

Then it tries to explain why he killed his children.

No good comes to children whose parents divorce, and Mammone wasn't going to allow their safety and innocence to be compromised, the letter states, although the writer doesn't specifically say what endangered the children.

"I did not wish for harm to come to my children, but I concluded there was no other way to ensure they were going to receive to proper spiritual care they had been promised," the letter states.

After the children's deaths, Mammone became enraged and went to Eakin's home, where he killed her, according to the letter.

"While I confess to being totally without just cause for needlessly murdering Margaret Eakin, I still feel as though I did the most merciful thing I could do for my children (based) upon the conditions of their environment, and the bleak outlook of the future they were to face," the letter states. "If the public is outraged over the loss of my (children's) life, then I beseech them to not let Macy and James die in vain!"

"Stop getting divorces!

"Stop breaking up your (children's) homes!

"Stop making vows to God that you aren't (willing) to keep!"

ATTORNEYS DECLINE COMMENT

Assistant Stark County Prosecutor Chryssa Hartnett declined to confirm or contradict the claims made in the letter.

With the case pending, "it would be improper ethically for me to do that at this point," she said.

The defense wasn't saying much, either. They've already said in court filings that Mammone doesn't wish to discuss the case with anyone without his lawyers being present.

Sending letters isn't "part of our legal strategy, but a client has free will and can choose to either take or disregard the advice of counsel," said Derek Lowry, one of Mammone's attorneys.

George Urban, an attorney who has served as a spokesman for Marcia and her father, James Eakin, declined to comment on the letter.

A regularly scheduled pretrial conference on the case is set for Wednesday before Stark County Common Pleas Judge John G. Haas.

In addition to the murders, Mammone is charged with breaking into the Canton Township home of his ex-wife and trying to set fire to a truck parked outside.

The letter mentions nothing about those allegations. At the end of the letter, the writer comments on Mammone's "smirking" jail photo. The photo was taken a year prior to his arrest.

"I assure you all, I looked considerably more melancholy the morning my children lost their lives," the letter states.





Mammone trial jurors to be asked about views on divorce, child custody

Prospective jurors called in the capital murder trial of James Mammone III will be asked their views on divorce and child custody, in addition to their opinions on the death penalty and exposure to pretrial publicity.

Mammone, 35, of Canton appeared Wednesday in Stark County Common Pleas Court. He is charged with aggravated murder and other crimes for the June 8 deaths of his two children, James IV and Macy, and former mother-in-law, Margaret Eakin.

If convicted, he faces the possibility of a death sentence. Mammone's trial is now scheduled for January.

Wednesday's hearing came a day after a jailhouse letter believed to have been written by Mammone was published by The Repository.

The letter wasn't mentioned during the hearing. Judge John G. Haas ruled on several routine defense motions and briefly mentioned the topic of juror questions.

"Every case is unique as to which issues are raised and that is one of the issues in this case," said Stark County Public Defender Tammi Johnson on the issue of juror questions.

Police have said Mammone confessed to the killings, saying he wanted to hurt his ex-wife, Marcia Eakin, following their recent divorce.

The jailhouse letter calls divorce a tool of Satan and states that Mammone killed his children to spare them from the aftermath of divorce.

At the end of the hearing, the judge ordered Mammone to have no contact of any kind with his ex-wife and former father-in-law, James Eakin.

Neither the defense, nor Assistant Stark County Prosecutor Dennis Barr would comment on what prompted the judge to issue the no contact order.

A day earlier, Haas signed an order that no one is to meet or communicate with Mammone without the presence of his attorneys. The order affirms a request made by the defense at the beginning of the case.

Defense attorney Derek Lowry said the orders don't curtail Mammone from sending letters or making phone calls to individuals other than his ex-wife and former father-in-law.

Johnson and Lowry wouldn't discuss whether they'd talked to Mammone about the letter published in the newspaper.

When asked whether the defense is considering an insanity plea, Lowry said it's an option in any case, but wouldn't comment on whether the strategy will be used in this case.

Last week, the court gave the defense \$5,000 to hire a psychologist. Psychologists are commonly hired in death-penalty cases even when an insanity plea isn't pursued.







IN a year of numerous murders in Stark County, it looks like all of the cases are closed

All 12 of Stark County's homicides this year have ended in an arrest.

As far as investigators are concerned, all are resolved, though none of the suspects have been convicted or gone to trial.

A 100 percent clearance rate for the year is more impressive when compared to the national average, which is around 61 percent, according to FBI crime figures.

"That's been the one silver lining in a terrible year of homicides, bringing the suspects to justice," said Canton Police Chief Dean McKimm.

Canton has had 10 homicide victims in just seven weeks — between May 12 and July 2. There were nine in all of 2008.

The key to resolving them is following leads quickly, McKimm said.

"It's a lot of hard work on the detective bureau and (fast) responses from the patrol division," McKimm said.

RARE TRIPLE HOMICIDES

McKimm noted that two of Canton's cases were triple homicides, which are rare.

Police credit technology for playing a big role in helping them put behind bars one of those suspects.

Investigators looking into a triple homicide May 27 outside a southwest Canton bar were able to connect the shootings with a man who they say was involved earlier in a bar fight, said Lt. Jerry Steiner of the Canton Police Department's Detective Bureau.

And, he said, "We had real good information from (nearby) Aultman Hospital and security people there."

Federal agents tracked cell phone calls placed by Edward C. Martino III, enabling them to capture him on a train in New Mexico.

Police didn't have far to go to find a man they believe killed a woman and her grandchildren a few weeks later.

James **Mammone** III of Canton has been charged with shooting to death his former mother-in-law before fatally stabbing his two young children, ages 3 and 5. Police found him sitting in his car shortly after the shooting.

When it comes to solving homicide cases, Canton/Stark County Crime Laboratory Director Robert Budgake said, "Canton always did have a high solvability rate."

Alliance had one homicide — a father accused of killing his one-month-old child — and Massillon had another — a fatal shooting for which two men were arrested.

As far as the crime lab is concerned, Budgake said, "This year, our 2009 stats are running at the same pace as our 2008 cases. Statistical averages indicate that the homicides in Stark County should stop for the remainder of 2009. I guess we'll have to wait and see if this turns out to be an average year."

CRIME-FIGHTING TECHNOLOGY

The science involved in investigating a homicide case can be expensive, Budgake said.

"When we have this many cases this quickly, it puts a lot of pressure on agencies like us," he said, especially when it comes to forensic testing. A single DNA sample can cost \$370 for the crime lab to process, and in some cases, his agency receives multiple samples to test.

"In the Bobby Cutts (homicide case in 2007), we estimated, just on DNA, somewhere around \$30,000," Budgake said.

In 2008, his lab analyzed 1,227 DNA-related cases.

The crime lab's DNA system enables forensic technicians to analyze genetic material gleaned from a crime scene. They use two genetic analyzers, which review the DNA and show the results on a computer screen.

Every one of the homicides that involved a shooting this year involved the crime lab's Integrated Ballistics Information System or IBIS, Budgake said.

Bullets and cartridge cases can be entered into the IBIS equipment, enabling technicians to match and identify bullets, firearms and other pieces of hard evidence that is also entered into a national database for law-enforcement agencies throughout the United States.

"Anytime there's a crime with a firearm, this system would be employed," Budgake said.

Last year, he said, 538 firearms-related cases came through the system.

While he said, "That's a lot," he added that the number is "pretty typical of the last several years."

UNSOLVED MURDERS

While Canton detectives said they couldn't name the oldest unsolved murder case or say how many they still have on file, two cases from last year remain unsolved: The May 18 death of Paul Crowder and the Oct. 9 death of Kevin Gordon.

Crowder was outside of his red Pontiac Grand Am in the 200 block of Green Court NE when he was shot in the abdomen, police have said. He tried to drive away, but crashed the car into a tree a block and a half away on Second Street.

Gordon was found in a back yard in the 1400 block of Struble Avenue NE with a gunshot wound to the chest.

Anyone with information about those homicides should call detectives at the police department at (330) 489-3144.

As far as investigators are concerned, all are resolved, though none of the suspects have been convicted or gone to trial.

A 100 percent clearance rate for the year is more impressive when compared to the national average, which is around 61 percent, according to FBI crime figures.

"That's been the one silver lining in a terrible year of homicides, bringing the suspects to justice," said Canton Police Chief Dean McKimm.

Canton has had 10 homicide victims in just seven weeks — between May 12 and July 2. There were nine in all of 2008.

The key to resolving them is following leads quickly, McKimm said.

"It's a lot of hard work on the detective bureau and (fast) responses from the patrol division," McKimm said.

McKimm noted that two of Canton's cases were triple homicides, which are rare.

Police credit technology for playing a big role in helping them put behind bars one of those suspects.

Investigators looking into a triple homicide May 27 outside a southwest Canton bar were able to connect the shootings with a man who they say was involved earlier in a bar fight, said Lt. Jerry Steiner of the Canton Police Department's Detective Bureau.

And, he said, "We had real good information from (nearby) Aultman Hospital and security people there."

Federal agents tracked cell phone calls placed by Edward C. Martino III, enabling them to capture him on a train in New Mexico.

Police didn't have far to go to find a man they believe killed a woman and her grandchildren a few weeks later.

James Mamnone III of Canton has been charged with shooting to death his former mother-in-law before fatally stabbing his two young children, ages 3 and 5. Police found him sitting in his car shortly after the shooting.

When it comes to solving homicide cases, Canton/Stark County Crime Laboratory Director Robert Budgake said, "Canton always did have a high solvability rate."

Alliance had one homicide — a father accused of killing his one-month-old child — and Massillon had another — a fatal shooting for which two men were arrested.

As far as the crime lab is concerned, Budgake said, "This year, our 2009 stats are running at the same pace as our 2008 cases. Statistical averages indicate that the homicides in Stark County should stop for the remainder of 2009. I guess we'll have to wait and see if this turns out to be an average year."

CRIME-FIGHTING TECHNOLOGY

The science involved in investigating a homicide case can be expensive, Budgake said.

"When we have this many cases this quickly, it puts a lot of pressure on agencies like us," he said, especially when it comes to forensic testing. A single DNA sample can cost \$370 for the crime lab to process, and in some cases, his agency receives multiple samples to test.

"In the Bobby Cutts (homicide case in 2007), we estimated, just on DNA, somewhere around \$30,000," Budgake said.

In 2008, his lab analyzed 1,227 DNA-related cases.

The crime lab's DNA system enables forensic technicians to analyze genetic material gleaned from a crime scene. They use two genetic analyzers, which review the DNA and show the results on a computer screen.

Every one of the homicides that involved a shooting this year involved the crime lab's Integrated Ballistics Information System or IBIS, Budgake said.

Bullets and cartridge cases can be entered into the IBIS equipment, enabling technicians to match and identify bullets, firearms and other pieces of hard evidence that is also entered into a national database for law enforcement agencies throughout the United States.

"Anytime there's a crime with a firearm, this system would be employed," Budgake said.

Last year, he said, 538 firearms-related cases came through the system.

While he said, "That's a lot," he added that the number is "pretty typical of the last several years."

UNSOLVED MURDERS

While Canton detectives said they couldn't name the oldest unsolved murder case or say how many they still have on file, two cases from last

True justice can make us struggle

For those of us who believe in democracy, it's a hard thing to admit: We think our system is wonderful, so long as it works the way we think it should.

James **Mammone** III is a smirking reminder that there's a struggle to be had in embracing the notion of truly equal justice under the law.

Mammone's decision last week to plead not guilty to charges that he murdered his two young children and former mother-in-law is a real-world challenge to what we say we believe about democracy and justice.

Though police previously said **Mammone** confessed his guilt to them, under our Constitution, he is entitled to a trial as a result of his plea.

More than a few Stark Countians are resentfully angry over the idea that their tax dollars will be "wasted" on a trial for **Mammone** when it's so clear to them that he did it.

As hard as it may be for them to accept, in the eyes of our law, by everything to which we subscribe, James **Mammone** III is innocent until proven guilty.

If our legal system is to maintain its integrity, it cannot permit anything less.

FUMBLE

In 2006, Maurice Clarett, the former Ohio State University football star, was convicted of robbery and intimidation of a witness and sentenced to 31½ years in prison.

You may have heard that Clarett recently filed a request for early release, telling prison authorities that he's heard from NFL teams still interested in him.

It sounds as if he still doesn't get it. Prison isn't an interruption of one's life and career; it's punishment. In "The Mind of Maurice Clarett," a blog attributed to Clarett, he still seems unable to admit culpability.

Though Clarett has every right to make a living once he's served his time, he still hasn't said what needs to be said:

"I want to apologize to the people I robbed, the witness I stalked and the arresting officers I spat at, kicked and cursed.

"I want say I'm sorry to Jim Brown and Marcus Allen, for blowing them off when all they were trying to do is steer me on the right path.

"I ask forgiveness from Coach Jim Tressel for the stress and embarrassment I caused him and my teammates.

"I apologize to my former professors and to the Ohio State University for trampling on the free \$40,000 college education they laid at my feet.

"I offer mea culpa to the NFL for presuming that at 19, I was ready to compete with grown men after playing just 12 college games.

"I hope the Denver Broncos someday can excuse me for coming to their training camp utterly unprepared and unwilling to work my way onto the team. Like virtually everything else in my life up to now, I expected that a starting slot and millions of dollars simply would be handed to me.

"Lastly, I wish to apologize to all the kids who had my picture taped to the wall on their bedroom; who still dream of running in my footsteps; who badgered and begged their parents into spending money they really couldn't spare, to buy my jersey. More than anyone, you guys deserved better."

At some point in our lives, we all have dropped the ball. Everyone deserves a chance to pick it up and try again. When Maurice Clarett apologizes for his past behavior and means it, I'll be the first person cheering him on.

CANTON James **Mammone** III appeared before a judge Friday at the Stark County Jail and denied guilt to three counts of aggravated murder with death-penalty specifications and other crimes.

The hearing was **Mammone**'s first chance to enter a plea to charges he killed his two children and his ex-mother-in-law June 8, and that he tried to break into his ex-wife's home.

"The charges don't get any more serious than they are in this case," Common Pleas Judge John G. Haas told **Mammone** before reading the seven-count indictment aloud.

If convicted of any of the aggravated murder charges with an accompanying death-penalty specification, **Mammone** could be sentenced to death. Other options would be life in prison without parole, life in prison with parole eligibility after 30 years and life in prison with parole eligibility after 25 years.

Police have said he confessed to the slayings, saying he was trying to punish his ex-wife, Marcia **Mammone**, following their recent divorce.

Stark County Public Defender Tammi Johnson and defense attorney Derek Lowry have been appointed to represent James **Mammone** III.

They declined to comment on the case, as did Assistant Stark County Prosecutor Chryssa Hartnett.

Haas set a tentative January trial date. The judge held off on imposing a gag order, but he said he is sensitive to how publicity about the case might affect potential jurors.

"The less said, the better," he told the attorneys.

Haas also asked **Mammone** how he was being treated in jail and if he had any concerns.

Mammone said his only problem is getting food that fits his strict vegetarian diet.

Neither **Mammone**'s relatives, nor the family of his ex-wife, attended the hearing.

George Urban, spokesman for Marcia **Mammone** and her father, James Eakin, said they still are coping with the loss and didn't want to make the hearing a public spectacle.

MOTHER SPEAKS

Prosecutors have said they believe James **Mammone** III stabbed to death his children, 5-year-old Macy **Mammone** and 3-year-old James **Mammone** IV, sometime before fatally shooting his former mother-in-law, 57-year-old Margaret J. Eakin.

Reached at her home, the defendant's mother, Gilise **Mammone**, said she wanted to be at the hearing but had been told it wasn't open to the public, although it was.

"He's still my son, and I love him," she said.

In her first public comments since her son's arrest, an emotional Gilise **Mammone** said her heart is broken.

"I'm just absolutely crushed. I lost my grandkids, my only grandkids, and my son, my only child," she said.

With a trial pending, she wouldn't discuss details about her son, his marriage and divorce, or the allegations against him, but said the side of him accused of these crimes, "I never saw, I never knew."

"He always did so well with the kids," she said. "I just don't understand. I just don't understand."

CANTON James **Mammone III** appeared before a judge Friday at the Stark County Jail and pleaded not guilty to three counts of aggravated murder with death-penalty specifications and other charges.

It's the first chance **Mammone** has had to enter a formal plea denying the charges against him.

CANTON James **Mammone** III appeared before a judge Friday at the Stark County Jail and denied guilt to three counts of aggravated murder with death-penalty specifications and other crimes.

The hearing was **Mammone**'s first chance to enter a plea to charges that he killed his two children and his ex-mother-in-law on June 8, and tried to break into his ex-wife's home.

"The charges don't get any more serious than they are in this case," Common Pleas Judge John G. Haas told **Mammone** before reading the seven-count indictment aloud.

If convicted of any of the aggravated murder charges with an accompanying death-penalty specification, **Mammone** could be sentenced to death. Other options would be life in prison without parole, life in prison with parole eligibility after 30 years and life in prison with parole eligibility after 25 years.

Police have said he confessed to the slayings, saying he was trying to punish his ex-wife, Marcia **Mammone**, following their recent divorce.

Stark County Public Defender Tammi Johnson and defense attorney Derek Lowry have been appointed to represent James **Mammone** III.

They declined to comment on the case, as did Assistant Stark County Prosecutor Chryssa Hartnett.

Haas set a tentative January trial date.

The judge held off on imposing a gag order, but said he is sensitive to how publicity about the case might effect potential jurors.

"The less said, the better," he told the attorneys.

Haas also asked **Mammone** how he was being treated in jail and if he had any concerns.

Mammone said his only problem is getting food that fits his strict vegetarian diet.

Neither **Mammone**'s relatives, nor the family of his ex-wife, attended the hearing.

George Urban, spokesman for Marcia **Mammone** and her father, James Eakin, said they are still coping with the loss and didn't want to make the hearing a public spectacle.

MAMMONE'S MOTHER SPEAKS

Prosecutors have said they believe James **Mammone** III stabbed to death his children, 5-year-old Macy **Mammone** and 3-year-old James **Mammone** IV, sometime before fatally shooting his former mother-in-law, 57-year-old Margaret J. Eakin.

Reached at her home, the defendant's mother, Gilise **Mammone**, said she wanted to be at the hearing, but had been told it wasn't open to the public, although it was.

"He's still my son, and I love him," she said.

In her first public comments since her son's arrest, an emotional Gilise Mammone said her heart is broken.

"I'm just absolutely crushed. I lost my grandkids, my only grandkids, and my son, my only child," she said.

With a trial pending, she wouldn't discuss details about her son, his marriage and divorce, or the allegations against him, but said the side of him accused of these crimes, "I never saw, I never knew."

"He always did so well with the kids," she said. "I just don't understand. I just don't understand."

CANTON A Stark County grand jury issued its second capital indictment of the week Thursday, this time in the case of triple-murder suspect Edward C. Martino III.

Martino, 24, of 3203 26th St. SE in Canton Township, is charged with three counts of aggravated murder, according to the indictment filed Thursday by county prosecutors in Common Pleas Court.

Each murder count carries a death penalty specification and a gun specification.

Martino also faces an attempted aggravated murder charge and accompanying firearm specification and weapons charges.

If convicted of any of the aggravated murder charges with accompanying death specifications, Martino could receive a death sentence.

Martino remains jailed on \$25 million bond.

Authorities say Martino opened fire from inside a passing a vehicle, killing three people outside White Crown Cafe at 2528 Ninth St. SW on May 27.

The reason for the early morning shootings remains unclear. The bar was closed when Melissa L. Pinney, 31, and Jonathon Pierce, 32, both of Canton, and Pierce's cousin, De'Andre Ruffin, 22, of Massillon, were killed.

A 15-year-old girl who was with them escaped without injury. The attempted murder charge is tied to the girl.

Martino fled Canton, but federal agents caught him in Albuquerque, N.M., on May 29 after tracking his cell-phone calls and stopping him aboard a train bound for Los Angeles.

On Wednesday, a grand jury indicted James Mammone III, 35, of ██████████ on capital murder charges for the June 8 deaths of his two children and ex-mother-in-law.

As with the Mammone case, prosecutors presented the case to a grand jury before a preliminary hearing scheduled for Friday in Municipal Court.

Courts need to look again at 'rights' of abusive parents

Regarding "Mammone divorce, at times, a turbulent one" (June 9): The judicial system, whose role it was to protect this mother and children, should reconsider the "rights" of a parent with a history of abuse, neglect or violence. It seems that unearned and unwarranted "rights" are granted biological parents whether or not there has been responsible parenting.

Threatening a mother's life is child abuse, at the very least child endangering, unlawful and the basis for terminating contact with the mother and children except under the most controlled conditions.

How can a mother fearing her life not be affected in caring for children and such threats not cause the children anguish?

The Repository's account of court records indicates the court initially terminated the father's unsupervised contact with the children as well as the mother.

The court then ordered supervised visitation in their paternal grandmother's home — hardly the protection needed when there are threats to kill and possession of guns. Even this supervision was later discontinued, although the father violated his probation by continued threats.

No consequences were noted. Nor was it noted whether psychological help was obtained.

At the time of the divorce, liberal access to children was given the father, although the provision that he not contact the mother except in matters involving the children indicates continued concern about criminal intent toward her.

Recent child-custody practices are raising questions nationwide about whether children's welfare is a primary concern. Joint parenting may satisfy a parental wish for equal time, but is it always in the best interest of the child?

Citizens of this county have a right to know what went wrong, and an obligation to ask. We will carry to our graves the horror of these deaths. God help us all.

Will this be Canton's deadliest year?

Probably not, though police can do only so much to keep murder rate down

CANTON With eight homicides in the last four weeks, it would seem like 2009 could be Canton's deadliest year in recent history.

That may be true only if the current pace continues, and history shows that is unlikely.

There is no firm predictor when it comes to homicide rates, investigators say.

And 2009 seems to support that theory. No murders were recorded in the city during the first four months of this year. Then the recent spree of eight.

"It's horrific this is going on. I don't know that law enforcement can really have a huge impact on this," said Canton Safety Director Thomas Nesbitt.

The city's has averaged about nine homicides per year since 2000. The low came in 2002, when four were killed; the most was in 2006, when 10 were killed.

DIFFICULT TO STOP

Police efforts are thwarted by the unknown when it comes to preventing the violence.

"We could have a police officer on every corner, and this type of behavior still will take place," Nesbitt said. "The real issue is society, and unfortunately people's view on life anymore.

"A lot of this goes back to families, what they stand for, what they stood for and where they stand now."

When it comes to crimes such as domestic violence, they're unpredictable and "virtually unpreventable" by police and rarely end in death in Canton, said Lt. Jerry Steiner.

"A lot of homicides, it's usually people for one reason or another whose problems with the person that they kill don't always come to the attention of the police prior to the killings," he said. "It'd be nice if you knew a person was going to commit the ultimate act."

He said prevention then could be possible.

"But you just don't know ... You see a lot of homicides that are spur of the moment, emotions-out-of-control type of thing."

KILLINGS NOT RANDOM

Most of the 2009 victims were acquainted with their accused killers.

In the most recent case, James Mammone III, 35, is charged with killing his ex-mother-in-law and his two children.

"Most times on homicides, the victims do know their killers," Steiner said. "You always hear about serial killers, and there are plenty of them out there. But with homicides, the vast majority of the people who are killed know who their assailants are."

"It's not like somebody's running around out on the street randomly killing people."

Not that Melissa Pinney, Jonathon Pierce or De'Andre Ruffin knew the man accused of killing them in a spray of gunfire outside the White Crown Cafe at Ninth Street and Clarendon Avenue SW during the morning of May 27.

Police don't know for sure.

Detectives do believe, however, the trio — who also were in the company of a 15-year-old girl — just may have been in the wrong place at the wrong time.

The man charged in their deaths, Edward C. Martino III, 24, had been involved a dispute earlier that night inside the bar.

"What the investigation shows is those people were not a part of any of the earlier trouble ... And you have a person who, for whatever reason, decided to take some innocent people's lives," Steiner said.

MORE THAN ONE DEAD

Multiple homicides have occurred throughout Canton's history.

Since 2000, there have been two double homicides: A father and son in 2001 and a boyfriend-girlfriend in 2006.

In a New York Times article published April 9, 1892, a Canton man named John McCurdy shot his wife, identified only as Mrs. McCurdy, and S.T. Waltenbaugh, a co-worker he found in their bedroom. Then McCurdy shot himself in the head. Only the woman survived.

It is unusual that the city has had two triple homicides in less than two weeks.

The most violent act in recent years came in 1989, when a man was convicted of killing a family of five.

James M. Rash, 61, is in the Allen Correctional Institution. He was convicted of five counts of aggravated murder and one of aggravated arson.

Rash was living in his car parked next to his brother's home when he set fire to the duplex where his estranged girlfriend lived.

Authorities said at the time he knew she wasn't home, but the fire spread, killing a couple and their three small children, who lived in the other half of the duplex.

Rash was spared the death penalty. He will be eligible for parole in about six years.

CANTON A judge Friday increased bond to \$25 million for a Canton Township man accused of killing three people outside a bar last month.

Edward C. Martino III, 24, made his first appearance in Municipal Court since his arrest and extradition from New Mexico.

Martino, of 3203 26th St. SE, faces three counts of aggravated murder, one count of attempted aggravated murder and a weapons charge.

Police say he killed three people outside White Crown Cafe at 2528 Ninth St. SW on May 27.

City Prosecutor Ty Hauritz asked for the higher bond, saying Martino is a flight risk should he be released pending trial. The original bond was set at \$5 million.

Defense attorney Christopher Newlon objected to the increase.

"He's not getting out of jail on a \$5 million bond, so it doesn't matter," Newlon told Judge John Poulos.

But Poulos approved the higher amount, surpassing the \$15 million bond he set Thursday in the case of another triple-murder suspect, **James Mammone III**.

Martino didn't enter a plea during the brief hearing, which is standard practice for an initial appearance on a felony charge.

Before returning to a holding area for prisoners, Martino waved to someone in the courtroom. The mother of his children attended the hearing, as did some family members of the victims.

Newlon declined to comment on the charges or his client.

The reason for the early morning shootings remains unclear. The bar was closed when Melissa L. Pinney, 31, and Jonathon Pierce, 32, both of Canton, and Pierce's cousin, De'Andre Ruffin, 22, of Massillon, were killed. A 15-year-old girl who was with them escaped without injury.

Martino fled Canton, but federal agents caught him in Albuquerque, N.M., on May 29 after tracking his cell-phone calls and stopping him aboard a train bound for Los Angeles.

Another court hearing is set for next week, but the case could go directly to a county grand jury.

Like you, we live and work in this community. Our role in reporting and writing and photographing for this story has not been just about work or selling newspapers. It's been about getting our heads around how such a thing could happen to fellow residents. One of our co-workers lives just a few houses from one of this crime's ground zeroes. Another co-worker is related to one of its central figures.

This story came into our office just as it has come into your places of work and your homes — as an emotionally stressful pang of sorrow and hurt that hit close to home. How could such a thing happen? We've asked the question of ourselves and with shaking heads and trembling voices.

This story is not just a story. It's been part of us.

We tried, as we must, to be in touch with members of the Eakin family. Then we respected their wish to be left alone.

We honored their request not to publish in our news columns the photos the family submitted for the obituaries that appeared in this newspaper on Wednesday.

It's been about getting our heads around how such a thing could happen to fellow residents. One of our co-workers lives just a few houses from one of this crime's ground zeroes. Another co-worker is related to one of its central figures.

This story came into our office just as it has come into your places of work and your homes — as an emotionally stressful pang of sorrow and hurt that hit close to home. How could such a thing happen? We've asked the question of ourselves and with shaking heads and trembling voices.

This story is not just a story. It's been part of us.

We tried, as we must, to be in touch with members of the Eakin family. Then we respected their wish to be left alone.

We honored their request not to publish in our news columns the photos the family submitted for the obituaries that appeared in this newspaper on Wednesday.

We met with the family pastor, the Rev. Bill Pawson of Westminster Community Presbyterian, on Wednesday to work out a funeral coverage plan. As we told the minister, we wanted to provide coverage because we believed that the community was grieving with the family and would welcome information about the funeral to help them reach their own sense of closure, but that we had no wish for the work of our journalists to cause more stress or hurt for the family.

In the end, with Pastor Pawson working as intermediary, the Eakin family said they would welcome a reporter inside the church if she observed but talked to no one and would welcome a photographer outside the church if we published no photos of family members.

We agreed to those terms. Heckel and Monsewicz attended the funeral. They did their jobs, respectfully.

Judge won't lower \$15 million bond

CANTON James **Mammone** III called and text-messaged his ex-wife around 400 times before trying to break into her house Monday morning, according to court papers.

Police wouldn't detail what **Mammone** said in those messages. He is accused of killing his two children and former mother-in-law, and Wednesday made the first of what likely will be many court appearances. He remains in jail after Municipal Judge John Poulos refused to lower the \$15 million bond.

Mammone, 35, of 1424 Fulton Rd. NW, Apt. 6, is charged with three counts of aggravated murder, two counts of aggravated burglary, violating a protection order and two counts of misdemeanor criminal damaging or endangering.

HIS ATTORNEY DECLINES COMMENT

No pleas were entered on the charges, standard procedure for an initial court appearance on felony charges.

Assistant Stark County Public Defender Jean Madden filed a request with the court that no one discuss the case with **Mammone** outside the presence of his attorneys.

She said she briefly explained to **Mammone** how the court hearing was going to work, and would speak with him later. She declined to comment further on the case.

Authorities say **Mammone** fatally shot his ex-mother-in-law, 57-year-old Margaret J. Eakin, and killed his children, 3-year-old James **Mammone** IV and 5-year-old Macy **Mammone**.

He also tried to break into the home of his ex-wife, Marcia **Mammone**, in the 400 block of Aultmont Avenue NW in Canton Township, and poured gasoline on the home's rear door and a pickup, according to court papers.

Police have said **Mammone** confessed to the killings, saying he wanted to inflict emotional pain by attacking those who were most dear to his ex-wife. The couple's divorce was finalized in April.

Police arrested **Mammone** on Monday morning outside his home about three hours after Eakin's neighbors called 911. His children were found dead in the car.

Stark County Coroner P.S. Murthy said Eakin died as a result of two gunshot wounds, one to the head and one in the shoulder area, and that the children died from multiple stab wounds to their necks.

Murthy wouldn't say when the children died, and referred questions about the timeline of events to police, who have not yet released that information.

NO CONTACT WITH POLICE BEFORE ARREST

Police Chief Dean McKimm acknowledged that **Mammone** sent multiple text messages to his ex-wife Sunday and Monday morning, but wouldn't discuss the content of those messages.

The chief also said police didn't have any contact with **Mammone** during the time between the first 911 calls and his apprehension. He said officers staked out **Mammone**'s residence and arrested him when he arrived at the apartment building.

"He didn't even get his car parked," McKimm said.

Marcia Mammone and her father, James Eakin, didn't attend Wednesday's hearing, but attorney George Urban, who has been the public voice of the family, was there on their behalf.

The family is aware of how the court system works and has faith that county prosecutors will bring **Mammone** to justice, Urban said.

He also said the family is thankful to Canton police and first-responders at the scene, school officials and the community for its continued support and prayers.

James **Mammone** is due back in court next week.

We have to want justice, not revenge

"OK, he confessed don't waste money take out back shoot him!!" A comment on The Repository's Web site about James **Mammone III**, who confessed Tuesday to killing his former mother-in-law and his two children.

For those of us who are watching this awful story play out, it's the most natural thing in the world to want revenge. To feel the same hot-blooded thirst for satisfaction that **Mammone** may have felt Monday when, according to his confession, he killed because he wanted to make his ex-wife suffer. She will, for a lifetime.

James **Mammone III** is likely the most hated man in Stark County today. Which is why most of Stark County won't decide what happens to him.

This is what the rule of law is all about. It rules out mob justice. Only 12 people will make this decision— a jury and a judge.

The legal process that follows **Mammone's** arrest Monday will be long and involved. It will be excruciating for survivors of his three victims. Some observers might think it's utterly unnecessary, given the confession.

But society, represented by 12 jurors, must know exactly what happened, including from **Mammone's** perspective, before it passes judgment.

This is especially true in cases such as this where prosecutors are likely to seek the death penalty — the most serious action, short of war, that our society can take.

Mammone will appear in court, flanked by one or more public defenders, for the first time today. This isn't an empty ritual. It's how a criminal justice system has to work when it depends for its decisions on the rule of law, not the passions of its citizens.

As retired appellate Judge John R. Milligan said in answering a question for our recent Law Day project:

"A lawyer not only can, but should, represent a client known or believed to be guilty, to assure that, at every step in the proceeding, the client has been treated in accord with law and consistent with his or her constitutional rights."

This can be such a hard concept to understand, let alone believe in, when passions are running high. Maybe we can all ground ourselves for the weeks to come by thinking about what the countries that we Americans least respect would do in a case such as this.

We are not them. If we really believe in the rule of law, we have to demand a deliberate, orderly process that leads to justice, not revenge.

The service for Macy, 5, and James **Mammone** IV, 3, and their grandmother, Margaret Eakin, 57, begins at 11 a.m. at Westminster Community Church at 171 Aultman Ave. NW.

Calling hours will be held in the church from 5-8 p.m. Thursday and at 10 a.m. Friday.

Police have charged James **Mammone** III, 35, of ██████████ with three counts of aggravated burglary — along with other felony and misdemeanor charges — for a series of incidents Monday morning that ended with the children and their grandmother dead.

On Tuesday afternoon, Police Chief Dean McKimm said **Mammone** has confessed to the murders.

McKimm said **Mammone** told detectives that the deaths were an act of vengeance against his ex-wife, Marcia "Marci" **Mammone**. She is the mother of the two children and Margaret Eakin's daughter.

Police have said that James **Mammone** went to the Eakins' home on Poplar Avenue NW at about 5:40 a.m. and killed Margaret Eakin, who was found in a second-floor bedroom with multiple gunshot wounds. Officers arrested **Mammone** three hours later at his apartment. Police found the children's bodies strapped in car seats in **Mammone**'s car.

The deaths shocked family members, their friends and neighbors in the Harter Heights area where the Eakins and Marcia **Mammone** lived.

Local lawyer George Urban, a friend of the Eakin family, said family members asked him to field calls about the tragedy.

"I volunteered because I'm a friend first," he explained.

Margaret Eakin "was a great woman and cared tremendously for her grandchildren and her three children. She would have done anything for them. She was very proud of them," Urban said.

James **Mammone** II said he heard of the deaths and his son's arrest late Monday morning. He called it shocking and surreal to watch television news reports of the incidents.

"It's unbelievable. I feel sorry for everybody," the elder **Mammone** said. "It breaks my heart."

James **Mammone** III married Marcia Eakin at Westminster church in December 1998. At the time, the couple seemed a perfect match, **Mammone**'s father said.

But last year, Marcia filed for divorce. The next day, her husband promised to put her in her grave. The threat led to a misdemeanor domestic violence charge and conviction for **Mammone**.

When they married, **Mammone** worked as an insurance representative and Marcia was a college student, according to the couple's wedding announcement published in The Repository.

But when the divorce was filed, Marcia provided the primary income working as a teacher. **Mammone** was a part-time pizza delivery driver earning \$7 per hour, plus tips.

John Brenneman, who owns the Hungry Howie's Pizza outlet at 4887 Portage St. NW in Jackson Township, said **Mammone** showed up for work regularly and never had any complaints against him.

"Myself and all the employees send their deepest sympathies to the family," Brenneman said.

Reed Funeral Home is handling funeral arrangements.

The family asks that donations be considered in lieu of flowers. A memorial fund for the children is set up through Huntington Bank where donations can be made to the Marci **Mammone** fund. Donations can be made to Westminster Community Church in memory of Margaret Eakin.

CANTON City police say **James Mammone** III wanted to make his ex-wife suffer, and that's why he fatally stabbed their two young children and shot his former mother-in-law to death.

Mammone confessed to Monday's killing spree, police say. Now the 35-year-old Canton man will face murder charges.

"It appears the motive was he wanted to inflict severe emotional pain on his ex-wife," Chief Dean McKimm said. "He has been rather forthcoming in these interviews.

"We believe we obtained what we consider to be a full confession regarding the crimes at hand."

POSSIBLE MOTIVE

Mammone was arrested Monday morning outside his home at 1424 Fulton Rd. NW.

He is facing three aggravated murder charges in the deaths of Margaret J. Eakin, 57, who was shot multiple times inside her Poplar Avenue NW home, and **Mammone**'s two children, Macy **Mammone**, 5, and James **Mammone** IV, 3. The children suffered stab wounds to their necks.

Canton Police Department detectives have been interviewing **Mammone** since his arrest.

"He harbored ill-will," McKimm said. "He wanted to inflict emotional pain by attacking those who were most dear to his ex-wife."

City police also have charged **Mammone** with aggravated burglary based on an allegation he barged into Margaret Eakin's home in the 300 block of Poplar Avenue NW.

Mammone's ex-wife is Marcia **Mammone**, who lives in the 400 block of Aultmont Avenue NW, just outside the city limits in Canton Township.

Stark County sheriff's deputies also charged **Mammone** with felony counts of aggravated burglary and violation of a court protection order connected to his alleged attempt to break into his ex-wife's home.

County sheriff deputies also charged **Mammone** with two misdemeanor counts of criminal damaging or endangering stemming from allegations that **Mammone** poured gasoline over the door at his ex-wife's duplex.

He also poured gasoline on a pickup truck belonging to Harold B. Carter, according to complaints sheriff deputies filed with Municipal Court.

Carter is believed to be a friend of Marcia **Mammone**, said Stark County Sheriff Tim Swanson.

'MINIMAL TIMELINE'

Marcia **Mammone** lived a short distance from her mother, Margaret Eakin. The incident at Marcia **Mammone**'s home was reported to authorities within minutes of the homicide on Poplar Avenue NW.

Canton police first were notified of the shooting at Margaret Eakin's home at 5:41 a.m. Monday. Police located **Mammone** at 8:45 a.m., entering the driveway of his home on Fulton.

McKimm would not disclose when and where the children were killed.

"We don't want to engage in speculation," McKimm said. "We have released a fairly minimal timeline right now."

The two children were discovered dead strapped in child safety seats inside the vehicle **Mammone** had been driving.

"My belief is they were killed in those seats," said Harry Campbell, chief investigator with the county coroner's staff. "They were stabbed with a knife to the neck. Several knives were recovered from the car and other weapons. I am not going to be more specific."

Bond for **Mammone** is set at \$15 million.

CANTON James **Mammone** III wanted to "inflict severe emotional pain" on his ex-wife, according to city police, who say they have a confession from the triple murder suspect.

Mammone, 35, who was arrested Monday morning outside his home in the 1400 block of Fulton Road NW, is charged with fatally shooting his ex-mother-in-law and stabbing his two children.

City detectives have been interviewing **Mammone** since his arrest Monday morning.

"He has been rather forthcoming in these interviews," Chief Dean McKimm said.

"We believe we obtained what we consider to be a full confession regarding the crimes at hand. It appears the motive was he wanted to inflict severe emotional pain on his ex-wife. I don't know what the situation was. He harbored ill-will. He wanted to inflict emotional pain by attacking those who were most dear to his ex-wife."

Mammone is facing three aggravated murder charges. The victims are Margaret J. Eakin, 57, who was shot multiple times inside her home in the 300 block of Poplar Avenue NW, and **Mammone**'s two children, James **Mammone** IV, 3, and Macy **Mammone**, 5. The children were stabbed in their necks.

Mammone's ex-wife is Marcia **Mammone**, who lives in the 400 block of Aultmont Avenue NW, just outside the Canton corporate limit in Canton Township. Their divorce was finalized in April.

Stark County sheriff's deputies also charged **Mammone** with felony counts of aggravated burglary and violation of a court protection order in connection with his alleged attempt to break into his ex-wife's home Monday.

Canton police first were notified of the incident at Margaret Eakin's home on Poplar Avenue NW at 5:41 a.m. Monday. Nearly three hours later, police located **Mammone** at 8:45 a.m. Monday as he was driving into the driveway of his home on Fulton Road NW.

Bodies of the two children were discovered inside **Mammone**'s vehicle.

Police have not said where **Mammone** was for the three hours.

When asked when and where the two children were killed, McKimm said, "We are not releasing that information right now. We don't want to engage in speculation. We have released a fairly minimal timeline right now."

Mammone is scheduled to make his first court appearance Wednesday morning. He is being jailed on \$15 million bond.

Tuesday afternoon, public defenders Tammie Johnson and Jean Madden were in Municipal Court, arguing for **Mammone** to be brought before a judge that day for his initial appearance. Judge John Poulos denied the request.

Madden said there was no reason for **Mammone** to appear in court more than 48 hours after his arrest, and that his constitutional rights, including his right to remain silent, needed to be protected, given that the charges will likely result in a death-penalty case.

City Prosecutor Ty Hauritz said the hearing date was a function of when **Mammone** was booked into jail Monday afternoon, and that his rights weren't being violated.

The public defenders had not been officially appointed to represent **Mammone** — although they likely will be — and had not yet met with him. At the time, they were unaware that he had given statements to the police.

After news of the alleged confession surfaced, Madden said she had concerns about **Mammone**'s mental state and whether he understands his right to remain silent.

"When you hold (defendants) at the county (jail) for an extended period of time without access to counsel, that's a serious concern," she said.

Later, she filed court papers stating that **Mammone** doesn't wish to speak with anyone about the case without his lawyers present.

Mammone confessed to Monday's killing spree, police say. Now the 35-year-old Canton man will face murder charges.

"It appears the motive was he wanted to inflict severe emotional pain on his ex-wife," Police Chief Dean McKimm said. "He has been rather forthcoming in these interviews. We believe we obtained what we consider to be a full confession regarding the crimes at hand."

POSSIBLE MOTIVE

Mammone was arrested Monday morning outside his home at 1424 Fulton Rd. NW.

He is facing three aggravated murder charges in the deaths of Margaret J. Eakin, 57, who was shot multiple times inside her Poplar Avenue NW home, and **Mammone**'s two children, Macy **Mammone**, 5, and James **Mammone** IV, 3. The children suffered stab wounds to their necks.

Police Department detectives have been interviewing **Mammone** since his arrest.

"He harbored ill-will," McKimm said. "He wanted to inflict emotional pain by attacking those who were most dear to his ex-wife."

City police also have charged **Mammone** with aggravated burglary based on an allegation he barged into Margaret Eakin's home in the 300 block of Poplar Avenue NW.

Mammone's ex-wife is Marcia **Mammone**, who lives in the 400 block of Aultmont Avenue NW, just outside the city limits in Canton Township.

Stark County sheriff's deputies also charged **Mammone** with felony counts of aggravated burglary and violation of a court protection order connected to his alleged attempt to break into his ex-wife's home.

Sheriff deputies also charged **Mammone** with two misdemeanor counts of criminal damaging or endangering stemming from allegations that **Mammone** poured gasoline over the door at his ex-wife's duplex.

He also poured gasoline on a pickup truck belonging to Harold B. Carter, according to complaints sheriff deputies filed with Municipal Court.

Carter is believed to be a friend of Marcia **Mammone**, said Stark County Sheriff Tim Swanson.

'MINIMAL TIME LINE'

Marcia **Mammone** lived a short distance from her mother, Margaret Eakin. The incident at Marcia **Mammone**'s home was reported to authorities within minutes of the homicide on Poplar Avenue NW.

Police first were notified of the shooting at Margaret Eakin's home at 5:41 a.m. Monday. Police located **Mammone** at 8:45 a.m., entering the driveway of his home on Fulton.

McKimm would not disclose when and where the children were killed.

"We don't want to engage in speculation," McKimm said. "We have released a fairly minimal time line right now."

The two children were discovered dead, strapped in child safety seats inside the vehicle **Mammone** had been driving.

"My belief is they were killed in those seats," said Harry Campbell, chief investigator with the county coroner's staff. "They were stabbed with a knife to the neck. Several knives were recovered from the car and other weapons. I am not going to be more specific."

Bond for **Mammone** is set at \$15 million.

CANTON A local attorney issued a brief statement late this afternoon on behalf of the Eakin family.

"It's a horrible tragedy. The family is grieving," said attorney George Urban.

"They would appreciate some time to deal with this loss and tragedy."

Margaret's husband, Jim, does not wish to speak publicly at this point, Urban said.

"The whole family is together and ... making the appropriate arrangements and dealing with this as a family."

Urban said the family does "appreciate all the support and the outpouring from the community."

James **Mammone** III had been working as a pizza deliverer.

"Myself and all the employees send their deepest sympathies to the family," said John Brenneman, who owns the Hungry Howie's Pizza outlet at 4887 Portage St. NW in Jackson Township where **Mammone** was employed.

"He was a part-time delivery driver. He showed up for work regularly. We never had any complaints against him. I believe he has worked there for over a year."

County investigators say James **Mammone** III also tried to break in to his ex-wife's home while she was home Monday morning.

Broken windows can been seen in the doors to the Canton Township apartment on Aultman Avenue NW.

"It doesn't appear he gained entry. Upon our arrival, he was gone," said Capt. Gary Shankle of the county sheriff's staff.

It was 5:43 a.m. Monday when sheriff's deputies received an emergency call concerning the attempted break-in in the 400 block of Aultman Avenue NW.

The duplex apartment is just outside the Canton city corporation line, putting it in the Stark County sheriff's jurisdiction.

Marcia **Mammone** was in the apartment when the would-be intruder attempted to barge in.

"She felt that it was James that was attempting to break-in," Shankle said. "She didn't have any contact with him. She stayed upstairs. We are still looking at possible charges."

An autopsy was being conducted Monday on Margaret Eakin, said Stark County Coroner's Chief Inspector Harry M. Campbell.

"When we arrived, in an upstairs room, we found a victim of an apparent gunshot wound. The victim is Margaret Eakin, 57," said Police Chief Dean McKimm.

"Shortly thereafter, the police department became aware of a trouble call in the 400 block of Aultman NW. It was outside the city limits and our jurisdiction. Due to these two calls and the circumstances surrounding them, family members became concerned for the welfare of two children in the care of the suspect, James **Mammone** III, father of the children," McKimm said.

"James **Mammone** is the ex-son-in-law of Margaret Eakin, the first victim, and he's also the ex-husband of Marcia **Mammone** who lives in the 400 block of Aultman NW."

The Canton Police Department and Stark County Sheriff's office began a search for James **Mammone**.

Police caught up with him around 8:45 a.m. at an apartment complex in the 1400 block of Fulton Road NW in his vehicle in the parking lot. He was taken into custody.

"Unfortunately, officers discovered in the back seat of the vehicle two children who were expired, apparent victims of knife wounds."

James **Mammone** III will be charged with three counts of aggravated murder and one count of burglary. He was taken to the Stark County Jail, according to Police Chief Dean McKimm.

The Mammones lived in a home on Ridge Road NW before their recent divorce.

Neighbors there say they were aware of the break-up.

"One day she came over crying and said, 'Will you keep an eye out for me? I am going through a divorce. He might bother me.' She is a school teacher. She was the nicest person, the kids were nice," said Bob Kakascik, who lives in the 1400 block of Ridge Avenue NW, next door to the couple's former residence.

Kakascik described James **Mammone** as someone who seldomly did yard work.

"He was in another world," Kakascik said. "The guy was strange."

"He was some kind of salesman," said Brian Campbell, who lives in the 1400 block of Ridge Avenue NW, across the street from the Mammones' former home.

"I used to see him come in late, past what normal people would. I never saw any screaming, I never saw any fighting. He was always courteous to me and other people. But he was strange."

A neighbor had called Kit Kuhle who lives across the street from the apartment building in the 1400 block of Fulton Road NW.

"She said, 'Do you know there are two men sitting in a car in your driveway? They look like police,'" said Kuhle. "So I went outside and they rolled down their window and told me 'We're commandeering your home. We have a situation here.' Then they asked me to go back inside and stay there."

Only seconds later, as she watched from an upstairs window, she saw the unmarked car in her driveway speed across the street and block a tan car's exit.

Soon, police and city fire vehicles had blocked off the street. The suspect, John **Mammone** III, who witnesses say offered little resistance, was taken to the city jail.

White sheets quickly were draped over the tan car's windows. A tall tarpaulin was drawn across the driveway, blocking the view of the crowd that had gathered across the street.

Within minutes Canton City Police Chief Dean McKimm and Stark County Coroner P.S. Murthy arrived together, ducking under the yellow crime scene tape and disappearing behind the tarpaulin.

When Murthy was leaving the scene, he said, "I'll be frank with you. I have a dead lady in my office. And two children still are in the back seat of that car."

Asked how the children were murdered, Murthy drew his finger like a knife blade across his neck.

At 5:40 a.m., Ed and Katy Roth heard gunshots and a woman's screams near their Poplar Avenue NW home. Ed grabbed his cell phone and headed outside, where he saw a tan, four-door car speed away, heading north on Poplar. Roth ran to the home of his neighbors across the street, Margaret and Jim Eakin, and called for Margaret.

"I knew she'd be there with the kids," he said, referring to Eakin's grandchildren, Macy, 5, and James **Mammone**, 3. Margaret Eakin cared for the children while their mother, Eakin's daughter, Marcia **Mammone**, recently divorced, worked, neighbors said.

Neighbor Tricia King came out of her home, also spotting the tan car.

"It just seemed to stop at Fourth Street (NW) and sit there longer than you would have thought for the way it was speeding up the street," she recalled, adding that she had heard three gunshots.

Canton police have scheduled a press conference for 2 p.m. at City Hall.

The conference is to "share limited details regarding three homicides that took place early this morning in Canton."

Attorney Gary Procario, who represented James **Mammone** III in his April divorce from Marcia **Mammone**, was shocked by the news. "Oh, no. Oh, no," he said, acknowledging that he also had represented James **Mammone** when **Mammone**'s wife filed for an order of protection after a domestic violence incident.

Procario declined further comment.

More details from their divorce decree:

Marcia had residential placement and custody of their two children, Macy and James IV.

James had companionship visits several days a week:

Pickup and drop off at Margaret Eakin's home on Poplar Avenue NW.

Marcia **Mammone** a civil protection order against James following his threats in June 2008.

The order was still in effect Monday, court records show.

James **Mammone** III has listed his occupation in court papers as a pizza delivery man and a student at Kent State Stark.

James **Mammone** III, 35, was arrested and charged with domestic violence on June 13, 2008.

Investigators say he told his wife, "I'll put you in a grave" and "I'm going to kill you."

He was pleaded no contest to the misdemeanor charge and was convicted in Municipal Court. He was put on probation for two years.

James **Mammone** III and his wife, Marcia, were married on Dec. 5, 1998.

Their divorce was finalized April 17 of this year.

The victims in today's slaying have been released:

- Margaret J. Eakin, 57, of Poplar Ave. NW. She died from multiple gunshot wounds.
- Macy **Mammone**, 5, and her brother, James **Mammone** IV, 3, were found with their throats slashed.

The children's father, James **Mammone** III, is in custody.

Stark County Coroner's office chief inspector Harry M. Campbell said autopsies would be conducted on the victims today and Tuesday.

Michele Evans-Gardell, superintendent of Canton City Schools, said the district's internal crisis team has been activated to provide support, including coping help, to teachers and other faculty members within the district.

Marcia "Marci" **Mammone** teaches math at Timken High School, and she has "a lot of close friends in the teaching ranks," at both Timken and McKinley High School, Evans-Gardell said.

"This is a very sad day for Canton City Schools," she added. "Everyone is still reeling."

CANTON Bob Kakascik remembers the day his neighbor, Marcia **Mammone**, came to his home, crying.

"'Will you keep an eye out for me? I am going through a divorce,'" Kakascik recalled her asking. She was afraid her estranged husband, James **Mammone** III, might bother her.

"She was the nicest person; the kids were nice," said Kakascik, who lives in the 1400 block of Ridge Road NW, next door to the couple's former residence.

Authorities say James **Mammone** III, 35, killed his children — 5-year-old Macy and 3-year-old James IV — and his former mother-in-law, Margaret J. Eakin, 57, on Monday.

James and Marcia **Mammone** married in 1998, records show.

Marcia, 29, is a math teacher at Canton City's Timken High School. In court papers, James listed his occupations as a pizza delivery man and Kent State University Stark Campus student, although he is no longer enrolled, according to the university.

Marcia filed for divorce June 12, 2008. A day later, James threatened her, saying "I'll put you in a grave," and "I'm going to kill you," according to a domestic-violence complaint.

James was convicted a week later, after pleading no contest to misdemeanor domestic violence.

Municipal Court Judge Mary Falvey placed him on probation for two years, ordered him to comply with a psychological program and told him to have no contact with Marcia, according to court papers.

A week later, Marcia sought a civil protection order. In paperwork, she said James repeatedly threatened to kill her if she left him.

The protection order barred James from having any contact with Marcia or the children outside of court-approved supervision.

A Stark County Family Court magistrate initially allowed James to have supervised visits with his children only at his mother's home. Later, the visits became unsupervised.

In March, the Mammones came to court with their attorneys and agreed to settle the divorce. The final order was filed in April.

The Mammones agreed the children would stay with Marcia, and James would have visitation three days a week, including overnight visits on alternating Sundays and Tuesdays, according to court papers and an audio recording of the hearing.

The children were to be picked up and dropped off at Eakin's house and had to spend the night at the home of James' mother, until he found suitable housing, according to court papers.

James was allowed to text message Marcia only when he had the children and only with respect to matters involving them.

He also agreed to give up his guns in return for proceeds from their sale by Marcia's father.

To the outside world, this may paint a picture of Canton that is at odds with everyday life here.

We who love this city know that, but it is a concern for another day.

Today the community grieves with and for Marcia **Mammone** and her family, as we did two weeks ago with and for the families of Jonathon Pierce, De'Andre Ruffin and Melissa L. Pinney.

All of the families are facing the unimaginable finality of their loved ones' violent deaths.

The circumstances of the two tragedies were so different.

The victims Monday were Mrs. **Mammone**'s two children, 5-year-old Macy and 3-year-old James **Mammone** IV, and her mother, Margaret Eakin. They allegedly were targeted by the children's father.

On May 27, the three adults were gunned down at random outside a closed bar.

But all six victims shared a fate that they didn't invite and didn't deserve.

It's true, as the poet said, that no man is an island. Six lives have been senselessly extinguished in an instant. We are all diminished by these killings.

We cannot share the depth of the pain the families are feeling, but this community will stand with them in any way we can, for as long as necessary.

CANTON Bob Kakascik remembers the day his neighbor, Marcia **Mammone**, came to his home, crying.

"Will you keep an eye out for me? I am going through a divorce," Kakascik recalled her asking. She was afraid her estranged husband, James **Mammone** III, might bother her.

"She was the nicest person; the kids were nice," said Kakascik, who lives in the 1400 block of Ridge Road NW, next door to the couple's former residence.

Authorities say James **Mammone** III, 35, killed his children — 5-year-old Macy and 3-year-old James IV — and his former mother-in-law, Margaret J. Eakin, 57, on Monday.

James and Marcia **Mammone** married in 1998, records show.

Marcia, 29, is a math teacher at Timken High School. In court papers, James listed his occupations as a pizza delivery man and Kent State University Stark campus student, although he no longer is enrolled, according to the university.

Marcia filed for divorce June 12, 2008. A day later, James threatened her, saying "I'll put you in a grave," and "I'm going to kill you," according to a domestic violence complaint.

James was convicted a week later, after pleading no contest to misdemeanor domestic violence.

Municipal Court Judge Mary Falvey placed him on probation for two years, ordered him to comply with a psychological program and told him to have no contact with Marcia, according to court papers.

A week later, Marcia sought a civil protection order. In paperwork, she said James repeatedly threatened to kill her if she left him.

The protection order barred James from having any contact with Marcia or the children outside of court-approved supervision.

A Stark County Family Court magistrate initially allowed James to have supervised visits with his children only at his mother's home. Later, the visits became unsupervised.

In March, the Mammones came to court with their attorneys and agreed to settle the divorce. The final order was filed in April.

The Mammones agreed the children would stay with Marcia, and James would have visitation three days a week, including overnight visits on alternating Sundays and Tuesdays, according to court papers and an audio recording of the hearing.

The children were to be picked up and dropped off at Eakin's house and had to spend the night at the home of James' mother, until he found suitable housing, according to court papers.

James was allowed to text message Marcia only when he had the children and only with respect to matters involving them.

He also agreed to give up his guns in return for proceeds from their sale by Marcia's father.

James' divorce attorney, Gary Procaro, was shocked at news of the killings.

"Oh, no. Oh, no," he said, but declined further comment.

A call seeking comment was left for Marcia's lawyer, Stanley Rubin.

Brian Campbell, who lives across the street from the Mammones' former home, said he never saw the Mammones fight.

"I never saw any screaming; I never saw any fighting," Campbell said. "He was always courteous to me and other people. But he was strange."

'He's been acting crazy all night

— **Marcia Mammone** talking about her ex-husband to a 911 dispatcher

CANTON One year ago, James **Mammone** III threatened to send his wife to her grave.**Marcia Mammone** is alive today, but her two young children are dead, police say, at the hands of their father.**James Mammone** also is accused of murdering his former mother-in-law, Margaret J. Eakin, during a wave of violence that began just before dawn Monday at Eakin's house and ended hours later with the children's bodies being recovered from a car outside **James Mammone**'s apartment building at 1424 Fulton Rd. NW.**Mammone** III, 35, is charged by Canton police with three counts of aggravated murder and one count of aggravated burglary. He is being held in the Stark County Jail in lieu of \$15 million bond, accused of stabbing his children — **Macy Mammone**, 5, and **James Mammone** IV, 3 — in their throats. Their bodies were found in their car seats.

"It's a horrible tragedy. The family is grieving," attorney George Urban said on behalf of the Eakin family.

It was the city's second triple homicide in less than two weeks.

POLICE WON'T SPECULATE

Canton police have released some details but are being cautious as detectives continue investigating the deaths.

The sequence of events, including when the children were killed, remained unclear late Monday, Canton Police Chief Dean McKimm said. He declined to elaborate on the motive for the murders.

But court records show **James Mammone** III — after learning last June that his wife wanted a divorce — told **Marcia Mammone** he would put her "in a grave."

He pleaded no contest to domestic violence, a misdemeanor, and was sentenced to two years probation, according to court records.

Marcia Mammone had a civil protection order in effect against him. Their divorce was finalized April 17.

SHOTS AWAKEN NEIGHBORS

The drama began around 5:40 a.m. at the home of Margaret and Jim Eakin of the 300 block of Poplar Avenue NW.

Neighbors Ed and Katy Roth said they heard gunshots and a woman screaming.

"I grabbed my cell phone and headed for the door," said Ed Roth who lives across the street from the Eakins in the quiet Harter Heights neighborhood. "I saw a tan, four-door car heading north on Poplar as I was running across the street. It stopped at the stop sign on Fourth Street (NW) and hesitated, then turned right."

Roth said he went to the Eakins' front door and called for Margaret Eakin, knowing her husband already had left for work. There was no response.

By then, Katy Roth was on the scene and another neighbor, Tricia King, who heard three gunshots, had come out of her house nearby.

The trio spotted the tan car again heading toward the Eakins' home and quickly returned to their respective homes.

Police arrived soon after and found Margaret Eakin in an upstairs room with multiple gunshot wounds. She was taken by a Canton City Fire Department squad to Aultman Hospital and pronounced dead at 6:38 a.m.

One murder charge and the burglary charge are tied to the Poplar Avenue address, according to court records.

Margaret Eakins routinely cared for her grandchildren while her daughter, **Marcia Mammone**, worked as a schoolteacher. The Mammones would pick up or drop off the children at the Eakins home, according to court records.**James Mammone** had picked up his son and daughter Sunday for a visit.

FRANTIC CALL

Moments after Poplar Avenue NW residents reported gunshots in their neighborhood, **Marcia Mammone** — who lives in a Aultmont Avenue

NW duplex less than one-quarter mile from her parents' home — was calling for help.

She told emergency dispatchers that her ex-husband was in the driveway of the duplex pouring gasoline over a vehicle parked there. Meanwhile, she said she could see her children in the back seat of James **Mammone**'s car.

"He's been acting crazy all night. He needs arrested," Marcia says on the 911 tape.

Seconds later Marcia's voice became frantic.

"He just broke in! Oh My God. He just broke in!" she said. "Please just get someone here. He's probably pouring gasoline downstairs, too!"

Mammone smashed the rear screen door, but didn't get into the house. He might have been frightened away by a friend who was there with Marcia. Shattered glass was piled at the back door.

Stark County sheriff's deputies were sent to the residence, which is in Canton Township, but James **Mammone** was gone when deputies arrived.

Tire tracks show that he drove through grass to the parking area of neighboring apartment houses, then likely drove south on Harter Avenue and cut over to Poplar Avenue.

"What it appears in our investigation is that individual that was arrested in the triple homicide had also been at that residence and tried to gain entry," Sheriff's Capt. Gary Shankle said.

Marcia stayed upstairs until deputies arrived. "She didn't have any contact with him," Shankle said, adding that deputies are looking into charges against James **Mammone**.

TRAGIC ENDING

Investigators tied the shooting and attempted break-in together quickly. Realizing that **Mammone** had his children, officers began searching. They later descended on an apartment building at 1424 Fulton, where residents said **Mammone** lived on the second floor.

Police have not said where **Mammone** might have gone during the three hours after he left Marcia's duplex.

Around 8:45 a.m., police followed **Mammone**'s tan Oldsmobile Cutlass Supreme into the Fulton apartment's driveway. Plain clothes officers used an unmarked vehicle to block his escape.

"I was just watching television," said John Watts, a tenant in an adjacent building who went to his window when he heard shouting and saw officers with guns drawn ordering **Mammone** out of the car.

McKimm said **Mammone** didn't resist and was taken into custody without incident.

That's when police found the children in the car.

Soon emergency vehicles blocked the street. White sheets draped the car's windows. A tall tarpaulin was drawn across the driveway blocking the view of a crowd gathered across the street.

Stark County Coroner's office chief inspector Harry M. Campbell said autopsies of the three victims began on Monday. Coroner P.S. Murthy had expected to finish Mrs. Eakin on Monday and the children on Tuesday.

TIME LINE

5:41 a.m.: Residents in the 300 block of Poplar Street NW call 911 after hearing gunshots and a woman's screams. Canton police respond, finding 57-year-old Margaret Eakin with gunshot wounds in an upstairs room of her home.

5:43 a.m.: Stark County Sheriff's Office receive a 911 call from Marcia **Mammone** on Aultmont Avenue NW. She said James **Mammone III**, her former husband was trying to break down the door of her home.

6:38 a.m.: Margaret Eakin is pronounced dead at Aultman Hospital.

8:45 a.m.: Canton police officers find James **Mammone III** in the driveway of his apartment building at 1424 Fulton Rd. NW. He is arrested without incident. Officers find his two children in the back seat of **Mammone**'s car. They appear to have died from knife wounds.

2 p.m.: Chief Dean McKimm holds a press conference telling reporters that James **Mammone III** will be charged with three counts of aggravated murder and one count of aggravated burglary. He currently is in the Stark County Jail on a \$15 million bond.



DeLuca remarked how tasteless it was to publish the letters and how he believed the decision was made to print the letters as a way to sell newspapers, which he stated was disgusting.

We then moved into music, and took a few phone calls from listeners who supported DeLuca's views. From approximately 6:43 AM until approximately 6:59 AM, roughly 3 phone calls were aired.

The discussion wrapped up at the top of the hour, and we moved on.


