STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On September 10, 2007, I pled guilty, pursuant to a written plea agreement to one count of conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute heroin, resulting in serious bodily injury, in violation of 21 U.S.C. § 846. See Crim. ECF No. 4:07cr 42(b) at Dkt # 870, On December 19, 2007, the District Court sentenced me to 240 months' imprisonment. Id at Dkt. #1198. I did not file a direct appeal or a certificate of appeal even after I told my attorney to appeal my conviction as I did not break the law as there was no person(s) that resulted in serious bodily injury. After my attorney failed to file a timely notice of appeal, I filed unsuccessfully motions to vacate, set aside, or correct sentence pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2255 and a petition for writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241.

On September 10, 2012, I filed my first § 2255 motion, which was denied because it was barred by the one-year statute of limitations of the Antiterrorism and Effective Death Penalty of 1996 ("AEDPA"). See Civ. ECF '4:12cv585. On September 30, 2016, I filed a second § 2255 motion, which was dismissed for lack of jurisdiction because it was a successive motion, and I had not obtained permission from the Fifth Circuit to file it. See Civ. ECF No. 4:16 cv 757. On May 13, 2019, I filed a petition for writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241 in which again I challenged my conviction. It was recharacterized as a § 2255 motion and dismissed for lack of jurisdiction because it was successive. See Civ. ECF No. 4:19cv 362. I am entitled to relief from my conviction based on Garza v. Idaho, 139 S.Ct. 738(2019) where presumption of prejudice applied, where I instructed my trial counsel to file a notice of appeal but trial counsel decided not to do so, resulting in all my denials of § 2255 and § 2241.

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

Therefore, I respectfully ask that the decision be reversed (Exhibit A) in light of Garza v. Idaho, 139 S.Ct. 738 (2019) and my due process rights of the Fifth Amendment Due Process Clause to the United States Constitution when my trial court failed to file a timely notice of appeal, resulting in the subsequent denials of my § 2255 and § 2241 motions.

CONCLUSION

The petition for a writ of certiorari should be granted.
