Dear Clerks of the Court:

I write to apprise you of non-substantive errors in my Petition for Certiorari, filed on January 30, 2023. When composing drafts of my petition, I inadvertently used a text field longer than the allowed 7½ inches. When finished with all substantive aspects of my petition, I then entered all the internal page references, namely, the page numbers in the Table of Contents, Table of Authorities, Table of Appendices, and, within the petition, references to pages in the Appendix and to other pages of the petition itself (e.g., Petition, at p. 37, referencing "App.47" and "supra, 25-28").


Later, I realized that my text field was too long, and I reduced the vertical text field accordingly. But in doing so, the pagination obviously changed and so the internal page references had to be correspondingly changed. But I forgot to change the internal page references, and realized my error when it was too late. As a result of my blunder, the internal page references are by and large incorrect.

Attached to this letter are the corrected, internal page references. In particular, attached to this letter are:

- The Table of Contents with the corrected page references;
- The Table of Authorities with the corrected page references;
- A Table of Errata, identifying the erroneous internal page references within the Petition, and the corrections thereto;
- The Table of Appendices with the corrected page references.

I sincerely apologize for the inconvenience my mistake has caused.
