I am counsel to the respondents in this case. Petitioner's Petition for Writ of Certiorari was filed on January 21, 2023 and docketed on April 17, 2023. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 15.3, a brief in opposition is due to be filed today. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, respondents respectfully request that the time for filing a brief in opposition be extended by 48 hours through May 19, 2023.

Good cause exists for this request. This will be my first case before the Supreme Court and my first request for an extension in this case. Although notice of the docketing of the subject Petition was emailed on April 19, 2023, I did not receive a copy of the actual Petition and formal Notice until May 2, 2023. According to the postmark on the envelope, the petitioner mailed the Petition to my office on May 1, 2023, which explains the delay in service.
