## APPLICATION TO JUSTICE KAVANAUGH TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE A PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

To the Honorable Brett M. Kavanaugh, as Circuit Justice for the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit:

James Douglas Fox respectfully requests a 60-day extension of time to file its petition for writ of certiorari. This request, if granted, would extend the deadline from January 1, 2023, to March 2, 2023. Mr. Fox will be asking this Court to review a judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit, issued on August 29, 2022 (App. 1). The Sixth Circuit denied rehearing en banc on October 3, 2022 (App. 28). The Court's jurisdiction to review the Sixth Circuit's judgment rests on 28 U.S.C. § 1254.

James Douglas Fox requests this extension of time for the following reasons:

1. Counsel for James Douglas Fox, Robyn Beale Williams, has recently had to attend to sensitive and serious health issues of a family member which have made it difficult for her to prepare the petition for writ of certiorari. Ms. Williams' spouse was diagnosed earlier in the year with a rare and possibly fatal form of cancer. After multiple surgeries, the cancer was believed to have been fully removed with a small chance of spreading. However, more recently, it was learned that the cancer has, in fact, metastasized to multiple areas. Attending doctors' appointments and caring for her family has taken a considerable amount of time that could otherwise have been dedicated to the preparation of the petition for writ of certiorari.

2. In addition to Ms. Williams' family situation, she is sole counsel on this matter and intends to have another lawyer in the firm assist her in preparing the petition for writ of certiorari. The new lawyer will need additional time to get up to speed on the issues in the case.

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For these reasons, James Douglas Fox respectfully requests an extension of time to file its petition for writ of certiorari, up to and including March 2, 2023.
