Reason for Granting
60 DAY Extension
Rule 13.5

Petitioner is serving a 144 month consecutive sentence. A 132 month sentence imposed on 11/15/18 and a 12 month revocation sentence of which the FSA-2018 eligibility is found. US v. Andrews, Case No 7:01-cr-27-M. These consecutive sentences have two different judges within the F.D.N.C.

In Appeal No 22-7332, I aver that consecutive sentence of 144 months could have been reduced under the FSA under 404(b). The Judge "did not" under conspiracy "recalculate the sentence as required. Judge Meyers in 7:01-cr-22-M recalculated and denied the FSA-404(b) and Compassionate Release. The appeal is before the 4th Cir in 23-6281. An extension will allow a Petition for Certiorari and stays under 28 USC 2101(f) to be filed with the Supreme Court together for judicial economy on the same issue.
