MOTION TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE  
WRIT OF CERTIORARI

To our United States Supreme Court Justice Sonia M. Sotomayor.

NOW COMES, Antoine Riggins (Pro Se), on this 11th day of June 2023, requesting this Supreme Court grant him an additional forty (40) day time extension to file a Writ of Certiorari in this Court for the following reasons:

1. According to *Erickson v. Pardus* 551 U.S. 89 (2007), this Court has decided that "Pro Se litigant's pleadings are to be construed liberally and held to a less stringent standard than formal pleadings drafted by lawyers." *Id.*
2. The reason for this request of time extension is no doings of his own, as Petitioner has always been diligent in meeting time requirements set by any and all Courts.
3. Petitioner was not made aware of his denial for a *Rehearing Enbac* until almost two (2) months after the denial. (See Ex. A)
4. The Pennsylvania State Correctional Institution at Greene mailroom staff lied to, and mislead the Court of Appeals Clerk by returning the notice of denial (Order), without Petitioner ever viewing its contents. (See Ex. B) (FYI: The same mailroom staff did the same to this Court (See Ex. C). Petitioner learned this is being done in retaliation for unrelated matters, and has since filed a grievance)
5. The forty (40) days will put Petitioner in compliance with *Rule 13* (3) of this Court, but with a new date (Aug 4, 2023) to timely file for a Writ of Certiorari. (FYI: Petitioner without hesitation wrote the Court of Appeals Clerk, and requested mail be resent, also informing Clerk the reason Petitioner was giving for mail being returned to them (Letter is docketed with Clerk Office))

WHEREFORE, Petitioner humbly request your Justice Sonia M. Sotomayor grant the forty (40) day time extension for Petitioner to file for a Writ of Certiorari in this Honorable


