## MOTION FOR ENLARGEMENT OF TIME

COMES NOW, the Petitioner, Jeffrey T. Morris, *pro se*, requesting this Court to grant his second enlargement of time extending the time to file his petition for writ of certiorari. At present the petition is due on October 12, 2022. Petitioner is requesting another period of thirty (30) days until November 11, 2022. The reason for this second request is as follows:

1) The Petitioner's instant petition for writ of certiorari is due to be filed on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2022.

2) Petitioner's first request for enlargement centered around the reasoning that his retained counsel failed to timely notify Petitioner of his denial from the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals.

3) Petitioner has had a chance to research the rules and requirements of filing his petition in this Court and has found the Court's Rules are somewhat troublesome especially for a *pro se* litigant; similar to just learning a foreign language and trying to speak it fluently; its almost next to impossible. Petitioner wishes to file his petition in the proper manner, the first time.

4) The remaining time for filing this document is insufficient to ensure an adequate presentation of the Petitioner's argument on appeal.

5) Petitioner must proceed as *pro se*, he is untrained in the matters of law,

and as a result has to seek help of other inmates or certified inmate law clerks at the facility where he is presently incarcerated.

6) This facility has only four certified inmate law clerks to assist a population of approximately 1900 inmates.

7) The Respondent will not be prejudiced in this delay as no other motions are before this Court with the exception of this instant motion.


8) The Respondent will be served a copy of the Petitioner's motion for enlargement of time as indicated in the incorporated certificate of service.
