MOTION TO CIRCUIT JUSTICE FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Now comes Mr. Jordan before this Honorable Court to request, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.5, an extension of time to file his petition for a writ of certiorari regarding Second Circuit case no. 21-576. In support of this request, he states the following under the penalty of perjury:

1. Mr. Jordan is the movant in Second Circuit case no. 21-576. That case involved an application for a COA to appeal the denial (on procedural grounds) of his Rule 60(b) motion. The Rule 60(b) motion sought relief from what he asserted were errors in the decision of the Southern District of New York (in case no. 18-cv-3372) regarding his motion to vacate (under sec. 2255).
2. Mr. Jordan is presently incarcerated (at FCI-1 Butner), serving a term of 40 years imprisonment for non-violent witness tampering. FCI-1 Butner remains on "Code Red" status - owing to the Covid-19 Pandemic (and a high rate of cases in this county) - which means, among other things, that he has no access to a law library, or typewriter. (This motion is being created by sending an email to another person who will print it out and mail it back to Mr. Jordan!)
3. Owing to the Code Red status, Mr. Jordan also is separated from his legal papers. (He has asked his former counsel to mail him documents that he requires to prepare the petition for a writ of certiorari). Mr. Jordan is also restricted owing to several chronic medical conditions, including brain lesions that cause severe headaches, and degenerative disc disease that causes vertigo.

Thus, Mr. Jordan prays that he will be granted the additional 60 days so that he may complete and file a petition worthy of this Court's attention. *
