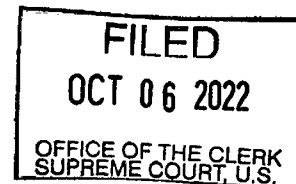

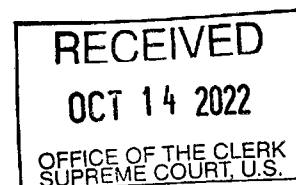

Application for Extension of Time

Comes now, the Petitioner TERRY COTTON in prose, and moves this Honorable Court pursuant to rule 13, Rule 21, Rule 33.1(h) and Rule 33.2 seeking an extension of time not to exceed 60-days in which to file his petition for writ of Certiorari.

Basis for Jurisdiction

The Petitioner asserts that this Court has jurisdiction based on Article 3, Section 2 Jurisdiction of Supreme Court, which states in pertinent part: In all other cases before mentioned, the Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction, both as law and fact.



The petitioner asserts that this court has jurisdiction based on the fact that exceptional circumstances warrant the exercise of this court's discretionary powers and that adequate relief cannot be obtained in any other form or from any other court.

The Petitioner asserts that the Trial Court located in Tallahassee, Florida lacked subject matter jurisdiction to detain him, let alone deny or dismiss any petition or motion he filed directly challenging its jurisdiction.

The Petitioner asserts that the First District Court of appeal located in Tallahassee, Florida lacked subject matter jurisdiction to per curiam dismiss his petition for writ of Certiorari on June 29, 2022 under case number 1D22-443.

The Petitioner asserts that the First District Court of Appeal located in Tallahassee, Florida lacked subject matter jurisdiction to deny or dismiss his motion for rehearing and motion for rehearing En Banc as C.J. Rowe, Judge Lewis and Judge Osterhaus did on August 4, 2022.

Judgement Sought To Be Reviewed

The Petitioner seeks to review the above mentioned actions due to denial of equal protection and due process of law afforded by the 14th Amendment under U.S. Constitution.

Reasons Why Extension is Justified

1. The Petitioner asserts that he needs assistance in filing his petition for writ of Certiorari.
2. The Petitioner asserts that copies of the Judgement(s) sought to be reviewed was arbitrarily taken from the person giving assistance by staff within this facility.
3. The Petitioner asserts that the State of Florida has unlawfully incarcerated him for the charge of felony battery that he was never tried and convicted for.
4. The Petitioner asserts that the State of Florida laced subject matter jurisdiction to civilly detain him, let alone unjustifiably deny him of his collateral challenge.

Wherefore, the Petitioner, TERRY COTTON, respectfully prays that this Court enters an order granting his Application for Extension of Time due to the extraordinary circumstances presented herein.

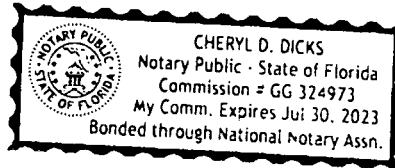

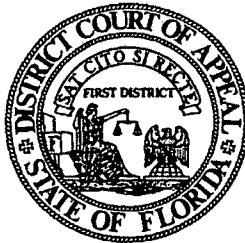
