Amicus Derek T. Muller holds the Ben V. Willie Professorship in Excellence at the University of Iowa College of Law. He teaches and researches in the areas of election law and federal courts. He has taught and written extensively about the rules concerning federal elections and testified before Congress in support of the Electoral Count Reform and Presidential Transition Improvement Act of 2022.

Amicus fully supports Applicant's request for a stay of the Eleventh Circuit's decision. Nor were proposed *Amicus* able to provide the parties with ten days' notice.
