PETITIONER'S VERIFIED MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
(To File Petition For Writ of Certiorari)


Now comes Mr. Jordan before this Honorable Court to request, pursuant to S. Ct. Rule 13.5, that he be granted an extension of time to finish preparing, and to present, his petition for a writ of certiorari with respect to the above Second Circuit case. As reasons for this request, Mr. Jordan states, under penalty of perjury, the following true facts:

1. Mr. Jordan was the appellant in the above Second Circuit case that regarded the return of property that was seized by warrant, and not forfeited, not contraband, and ultimately not used as evidence, but which was held in the event of a re-trial. (A copy of the denial of reconsideration accompanies this motion.)
2. Mr. Jordan is pro se by financial necessity, incarcerated, and, owing to continuing Covid-19 pandemic restrictions, without access to a law library, as such, this motion is being typed as an email, sent to family, printed, and sent back to him to sign and mail.
3. Mr. Jordan has another separate petition - regarding a Rule 60(b) motion - due shortly. He suffers from several chronic conditions, including brain lesions and cervical disc degeneration, that cause severe pain and dizziness.

The foregoing is true and correct, and thus Mr. Jordan prays that an extension will be granted.
