APPLICATION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE

Petitioner is currently incarcerated in the Marion Correctional Institution (Marion, OH) and was recently placed in the segregation unit (6/6/22 - 6/27/22).


Upon entrance into segregation, Petitioner learned that his legal work (including all of the research for his certiorari and the first draft of the petition) were confiscated from him and considered contraband. (Note: Petitioner's copy of the Sixth Circuit opinion was also confiscated by prison officials, so Petitioner regrets that he is not able to provide this Court with a copy of the opinion where relief is being sought.) (Also, Petitioner regrets that he must send this Court a handwritten application, for prison officials have also denied him access to the courts by denying

him the ability to print out typed up legal work.) At the earliest opportunity, Petitioner sought the release of this paperwork back into his property, but this request was denied by prison officials. Even after Petitioner stressed to the institution's administration that he had a deadline to finish up his legal work (7/3/22), the prison still denied him his right to these legal materials.

Because Petitioner will now have to start the research and preparation of his writ of certiorari afresh and anew, he humbly asks that he be granted this 60-day extension so that he may have adequate time to present an intelligible petition before this Court. Thank

you for your time and consideration of this matter.


