BY THE COURT:

This appeal is DISMISSED, *sua sponte*, for lack of jurisdiction. Dexter Conrad Jackson has appealed from a magistrate judge's report and recommendation recommending his civil complaint be dismissed. The magistrate judge's decision, however, is not final because the district

court has not rendered it final, and the record does not indicate that the parties consented to the magistrate judge's jurisdiction. *See* 28 U.S.C. §§ 636(b), 636(c)(3), 1291; *Donovan v. Sarasota Concrete Co.*, 693 F.2d 1061, 1066-67 (11th Cir. 1982) (observing that magistrate judges' orders "may not be appealed until rendered final by a district court"); *McNab v. J & J Marine, Inc.*, 240 F.3d 1326, 1327-28 (11th Cir. 2001) (explaining that we have jurisdiction over an appeal from a magistrate judge's decision only if the parties consented to the magistrate judge's jurisdiction); *see also Perez-Priego v. Alachua Cnty. Clerk of Ct.*, 148 F.3d 1272, 1273 (11th Cir. 1998) (explaining that a premature notice of appeal, filed before the district court has adopted a magistrate judge's decision, is not valid to perfect the appeal as of the date of the district court's subsequent judgment).

No motion for reconsideration may be filed unless it complies with the timing and other requirements of 11th Cir. R. 27-2 and all other applicable rules.
