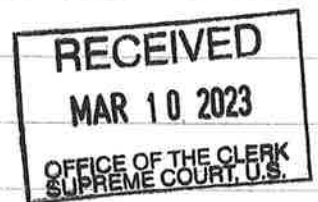

Relief Sought

Plaintiff - Petitioner Carlton Theodore Landis moves this Court for a thirty-day enlargement of time to file his Petition for Certiorari with accompanying Motion to Proceed In Forma Pauperis

Grounds for Relief

On December 8, 2022, the Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit entered judgment against Petitioner in Case Number 22-1365.



Petitioner has ninety days from the date of judgment to file his Petition for Certiorari.


Petitioner has completed his Petition of Certiorari, but Petitioner still needs to make copies of the Petition for Certiorari and to get prison officials to provide and certify his prison account statement so that Petitioner may submit his in forma pauperis application to this Court; Petitioner has been unable to accomplish this due to a string of lockdowns at USP-Melreary since December of 2022.

Inmates at USP-Melreary just came off of lockdown on February 28, 2023, and Petitioner very well intends to send his Petition for Certiorari and accompanying documents to this Court as soon as he is allowed to make copies of his Petition for Certiorari and obtain certification and a copy of his prison account statement.

Conclusion

WHEREFORE, Petitioner beseeches this Court to grant him thirty additional days to submit his Petition for Certiorari and his in forma pauperis application.
