

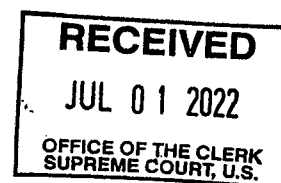

To Mr. Scott S. Harris, Clerk:

I am re-filing my previous motion for stay. Although I am revising it so that it is captioned for the highest court in the land, which is prefatory, your other filing rules may have been resolved with a phone call:

1. I sought relief from the appellate circuit court. The result of this was not an "order from the lower court" but a meager form response letter from the Seventh Circuit *pro se* clerk saying it would not file the motion for stay. After speaking with a *pro se* clerk on the phone, she instructed me to file a motion to stay the mandate, but then this also was refused, by the Seventh itself. I am attaching a copy of that order. If it behooves your court, I am not going to move to recall the mandate there, as the Seventh Circuit's response will be the same as before, otherwise they would have accepted one of the previous motions, so that order should suffice. It is the second to last document.
2. I did identify the opinion I am asking your court to review, I cited it exactly within my original motion, but I did not enclose a copy, so now one is appended to the end. I apologize, I assumed the Supreme Court of the United States has the ability to look up documents in lower Federal courts.
3. I did make a statement that I served all parties, I listed the two attorneys of record on my cover letter, in the portion denoted "Cc:", and said that I sent them a copy of the original motion. I will serve them with the same motion I now serve you, essentially the same document as before, but according to Federal rules of civil procedure certificates of service do not have to be remitted immediately, so I will send a follow-up letter with an official certificate of service, after I have deposited their copies in the mail and confirmed they have been received, unless I am incapacitated or perish, between now and then.



Note, you probably could be nicer to *pro se* filers, but I said what I want to say above. I expect it will take time for review, there are only nine justices, and probably many people sending you mail right now. That is fine. But I am returning both my original cover letter and yours, and ask that they please be filed with the case, as they show I filed well within time, substantially complying with the rules.
