6. Following a jury trial in 2018, Petitioner was found guilty of murder and, in January 2019, sentenced to 59 years in prison. This Petition for a Writ of Certiorari concerns whether Petitioner's speedy trial was violated. The Supreme Court denied Petition for Rehearing on January 23, 2023.

7. The Petitioner's requests for an extension is made in good faith and not for the purpose of mere delay. The Petitioner's regrets any inconvenience that this request may cause.

Wherefore, The Petitioner respectfully requests an extension of 60 days to and including June 23, 2023, to file the petition for a Writ of Certiorari in this matter.
