To Justice Jackson-Brown:

Application to Extend time to File Petition for Writ of Certiorari Comes now the petitioner, Schuylar Scarborough, and respect-fully moves this Court, pursuant to supreme court Rule 29, to grant him a sixty (60) day extension of time, from and after April 9, 2023, or until June 7, 2023, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-entitled cause, and states:
