To Justice Jackson-Brown:

Application to Extend time to File Petition for Writ of Certiorari

Comes now the petitioner, Schuylar Scarborough, and respectfully moves this Court, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 22, to grant him a sixty (60) day extension of time, from and after April 9, 2023, or until June 7, 2023, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-entitled cause, and states:

1. That petitioner's petition for a writ of certiorari is currently due on or before April 9, 2023. See attached copy of order affirming denial of post-conviction relief.
2. Petitioner is unable to file the petition for a writ of certiorari within the designated time period because:
  - a. Petitioner is a prisoner proceeding in this case pro se;
  - b. The prison limits the hours within which petitioner may

have access to the prison law library and the legal material contained there are very limited;

c. That the issues presented in this case are complex;

d. That petitioner has a limited knowledge of the law;

Therefore, an additional amount of time will be necessary for petitioner to prepare a proper petition for writ of certiorari.

3. The respondent will not be prejudiced by the extension, as no deadline is scheduled and no deadline will be impacted.

4. The respondent's counsel, the Attorney General of Oklahoma, has not been contacted regarding this extension request.

Wherefore, petitioner respectfully requests this Court to grant him a sixty (60) day extension of time, from and after April 9, 2023, or until June 7, 2023, within which to file a petition for writ of certiorari in this case.
